BAPTISM AT MT. CARMEL CHURCH

MARRIAGE ARRANGEMENTS

Carmel for at least six months. Couples sharing the same abode will be asked to live separately prior to their marriage .

St. Elizabeth of the Trinity



St. Elizabeth of the Trinity was a true mystic. Born in 1880, she entered the Discalced Carmelites in Dijon, France in 1901. She died in 1906 at the young age of 26, from Addison's disease. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1984 and was canonized a saint by Pope Francis on October 16, 2016.

According to Dr. Anthony Lilles, who wrote his doctoral thesis on St. Elizabeth and teaches theology at St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, CA, when Elizabeth visited the Carmelite monastery in Dijon when she was 17, "the mother superior there said, 'I just received this circular letter about the death of Therese of Lisieux, and I want you to read it.' That circular letter would later become the *Story of a Soul* [St. Therese's autobiography]; in fact, what she was given was really the first edition of *Story of a Soul*." Elizabeth was actually a contemporary of St. Therese, the Little Flower, who died in 1897.

At that time, Elizabeth was a very pious person who worked with troubled youth and catechized them; but when she read *Story of a Soul* she knew in her heart that God was calling her to become a Carmelite nun. Elizabeth then told her mother, but her mother told her that she couldn't enter until she was 21. This was actually a blessing, explains Dr. Lilles, "because Elizabeth continued to work with troubled youth throughout that time, and do a lot of other good work in the city of Dijon before she entered."

Elizabeth was also deeply influenced by a poem by St. Therese, "Living by Love," which celebrates how the love of Jesus was the heartbeat, the deepest reality of her life. Because Jesus lived to lay down his life for her, she desired to live to lay down her life for Him and for others, which means loving without reserve all those whom, in God's loving providence, she encounters; all with whom she lived. This idea inspired Elizabeth's own way of life and her own spiritual mission: to help lead souls into mystical prayer; to find and encounter the Lord.

Elizabeth experienced in a unique way the Indwelling of the Blessed Trinity in her soul. One of her most famous sayings is: "*I have found heaven on earth, since heaven is God, and God is my soul.*" She described her mission as leading souls to seek and find God in prayer:

"My mission in heaven will be to draw souls, helping them to go out of themselves to cling to God by spontaneous, love-filled action, and to keep them in that great interior silence which enables God to make His mark on them, to transform them into Himself."

St. Elizabeth of the Trinity is one of the ten Carmelite Saints painted in the top area of the sanctuary at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church.

St. Elizabeth's Feast Day is this Saturday, November 8. Let us pray to her, asking that we may always be conscious of the Indwelling of the Blessed Trinity within our souls. If we did so we would never sin and truly become saints!
