# This Week

# **Humility and Selfless Generosity**


Hello again! This week's readings point to two very important themes or virtues in our Christian life – humility and selfless generosity. In this Sunday's Gospel we find Jesus once again, who has been invited to a banquet on the Sabbath. Banquets are something very important in the Gospel of Luke. Jesus, as He has been doing, takes the opportunity to share a couple of teachings knowing clearly that he is being watched by the Pharisees. This banquet, like each one in this Gospel, prefigures the Eucharistic meal and the Heavenly Banquet is foretold.

Once again Jesus turns to the parables to share his teaching. First he addresses **the guests** and speaks to us of **humility**, which in the words of Manuel Garrido Bonaño consist in, the awareness of the position we occupy before God and before men, and the wise moderation of our desires for glory. We are invited to be humble and modest, not to look for the first places, but the last. It closes by quoting the old proverb: "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

The second parable is addressed to **the host**. Pope Francis points out how it focuses on the way to select the guests. Once again, in a reversal, Jesus presents us with the logic of God and not ours and invites us to seek the divine reward, not the human one. Jesus' invitation is to **selfless generosity**, to give without expecting anything in return, only the greatest joy, that of participating in the merciful love of God. Let's meditate through this Weekly Guide on these two virtues and put them into practice starting in our homes and then with those that are in need in our community.

### **CONNECT** with Scripture and Tradition



- Call to poverty of heart. #2544-2547




#### **Discussion Questions**

#### **Practical Activities**

For the Individual - Call someone you have forgotten Check if there is someone in your family, your circle of friends or colleagues who, due to any circumstance, you may have forgotten or marginalized in some way. Get in touch to say hello and ask how they are doing.

For Couples - Visit and listen a homeless' story
Volunteer at a homeless shelter and talk to someone who
has been rejected by society.

For the Domestic Church - Including those marginalized Make a commitment as a family to pay more attention to the marginalized in our community of faith and do everything possible so that they can be included in the different parish activities and events.

Missionary Mindset - Intercede and advocate
Intercede and advocate for the groups that for whatever
reason feel or are rejected so that something can really be
done to change this little by little.

When the litany of humility is prayed in a private setting by two or more people, the lines given in italics below are the responses to a leader.

O Jesus! meek and humble of heart, Hear me. From the desire of being esteemed, Deliver me, Jesus. (repeat after each line): From the desire of being loved, From the desire of being extolled, From the desire of being honored, From the desire of being praised, From the desire of being preferred to others, From the desire of being consulted, From the desire of being approved, From the fear of being humiliated, From the fear of being despised, From the fear of suffering rebukes, From the fear of being calumniated, From the fear of being forgotten, From the fear of being ridiculed, From the fear of being wronged, From the fear of being suspected,

That others may be loved more than I,

Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it. (repeat after each line):

That others may be esteemed more than I,

That, in the opinion of the world,

others may increase and I may decrease,

That others may be chosen and I set aside,

That others may be praised and I unnoticed,

That others may be preferred to me in everything,

That others may become holier than I, provided that I may become as holy as I should,





#### Word of the Week - PARABLE

**Parable**, from the Greek **parabole** (**para** and **ballo** = to put in parallel), in Hebrew corresponds to **Mashal** and it refers to a comparison whose purpose is not simply to offer an illustration, but to invite to look for meaning. In the different accounts of the gospels Jesus used them to share different teachings.


