#### **Choosing the Greatest Good**

In the journey of faith and life, it's not uncommon to encounter moments where we feel we may be choosing less meaningful things over the blessings and opportunities that God offers. This is a universal human experience and can be rooted in various factors. Weakness, laziness, lack of trust, ignorance of the true teachings of Christ and his Church, lack of appropriate accountability to others, and many other reasons contribute to this struggle. Growing in a life of faith, hope, love requires dedication on our part, though also realizing that we cannot save ourselves and we need the mercy of God.

The saints are fitting models for us, as they excel in the virtue of prudence. Prudence is the virtue that disposes practical reason to discern our true good in every circumstance and to choose the right means of achieving it (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1806) By growing faith and relationship with Christ, their relationship with the Lord guides their choices and priorities. Choosing the greatest good over worldly values, possessions, and concerns is a fundamental aspect of the lives of saints, rooted in their strong commitment to their faith and Christian virtues. Holy people prioritize the supreme good over worldly values by cultivating a deep relationship with God, practicing Christian virtues, serving others, and embracing detachment from material possessions. Their lives serve as examples of how one can navigate the challenges of the world while remaining focused on eternal truths and the ultimate good in accordance with their faith. The saints are known for embodying Christian virtues such as humility, selflessness, and detachment from material possessions. They constantly strive to live out these virtues in their daily lives, putting them ahead of worldly concerns. Most of all, holy people find true peace. Life is difficult, but no one can steal their joy because they have found the one thing that truly matters and actually lasts. In this Guide, let is explore ways we can seek God's grace and peace in the blessings and opportunities he offers.

#### **CONNECT** with our GOD through Prayer

- Let's start with *The Sign of Cross*.
- As we gather to share our faith, ask the Holy Spirit to be present.
   Use your own words or offer a <u>Prayer to the Holy Spirit</u>.
- As someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday, listen to the Lord speaking to you.
- Listen to one other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the *Collect*—opening prayer of Sunday Mass.

- Prudence disposes the practical reason to discern, in every circumstance, our true good and to choose the right means for achieving it. #1835

The virtue of prudence is one of the Cardinal virtues which are are firm attitudes, stable dispositions, habitual perfections of intellect and will that govern our actions, order our passions, and guide our conduct according to reason and faith. They make possible ease, self-mastery, and joy in leading a morally good life. The virtuous man is he who freely practices the good.

## WE ARE THE CHURCH

#### What Makes us Catholic? The Cardinal Virtues

The Catechism of the Catholic Church discusses the merits of the four Cardinal Virtues: "To live well is nothing other than to love God with all one's heart, with all one's soul and with all one's efforts; from this it comes about that love is kept whole and uncorrupted (through temperance). No misfortune can disturb it (and this is fortitude). It obeys only [God] (and this is justice), and is careful in discerning things, so as not to be surprised by deceit or trickery (and this is prudence)."



#### Word of the Week - Prudence

Prudence is one of the four cardinal virtues, identified by classical pagan philosophers as natural virtues and were later adopted by Church Fathers and Doctors as vital for the flourishing Christian life. With the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity, these virtues make up the seven which combat the seven deadly sins and lead to human happiness. Prudence aids us in those moments of impact so that we can behave in the most correct of ways, in accordance with the will of God, our Father. 


