

This Week

The RSVP Was "No!"

On my eighth birthday, my Godmother took me to the movie Cinderella. From that moment on, the thought of going to a formal banquet given by royalty intrigued me. For that reason, this parable always confused me. After all, who would RSVP "NO" to a king for the prince's wedding? I understood very young that the king was God and thought, "Who would turn down the King of the Universe?" My questions did not stop there because the story even gets stranger. Not only are the invited guests not coming, but the messengers and servants are killed while giving the invite. Really? I was taught that the Gospels had no wasted words and that each word was carefully chosen to lead us toward the truth. What truth is Matthew teaching us? Let's look deeper.

Jesus is not telling this parable to his followers; instead, he is speaking to the chief priests and elders, those who are respected and hold high office for the chosen people: the Jews. Jesus uses this parable as an extended simile. The wedding banquet is an image of the kingdom: heaven. In the Old Testament, the Jews thought they were the only ones to be saved and invited to the banquet. God sent many prophets to Israel to "invite" them to repent and return to the fold. Not only did they not repent, but the prophets, the messengers, the servants were often killed. Still, God remained faithful and did not stop inviting them. Unfortunately, the chosen still refused the invitation.

By this parable, Jesus now gives notice that the invitation is open to all nations, not just to Israel. Everyone has a place at the banquet. All we have to do is say "YES," and we get to be there. Right? No, not quite, because we must come to the banquet adequately prepared. We must dress ourselves in the virtues of faith, hope, and charity. We must do the work to become a true disciple so we can sit at the feast. Prayer is an essential part of our preparation so we may attend the banquet. One Sunday during his homily, Father David Michael Moses taught us a prayer that will help us become ready for the kingdom, "You, O Lord, who have prepared a place for my soul...prepare my soul for that place." Amen.

Practical Activities


For the Individual - Increase your Faith through Scripture



The Theological Virtues of faith, hope, and charity(love) are those virtues that relate directly to God. These are not acquired through human effort but, beginning with Baptism, they are infused within us as gifts from God. They dispose us to live in relationship with the Holy Trinity. Faith, hope, and charity influence human virtues by increasing their stability and strength for our lives. Growth in virtue is an important goal for every Christian, for the virtues play a valuable role in living a Christian moral life.








The Theological Virtues: Faith, Charity, Hope //<u>Italian (Umbrian) Painter</u> Italian

Each figure is accompanied by an attribute: at the feet of Faith a dog, a common symbol of fidelity; at the feet of Charity a pelican symbolic of Christ's sacrifice; and at the feet of Hope a phoenix, symbolizing Christ's Resurrection. The series of allegorical figures, viewed against a continuous landscape, was probably intended to decorate the back of a spalliere (a high-backed bench or day-bed) or to be set into a wainscoting.
