
What's Holding Me Bound?

What does it mean to be "bound?" To be tied up in such a way that we can't get loose, we can't get free. To have our hands cuffed, as it were, puts limits on our abilities. In the spiritual sense, this restriction keeps us from being able to do the things we were meant to do, that which we were created to do.

In his homily last weekend, Fr. James exhorted us to "name our sin." When we name it, we recognize it for what it is, and that breaks its power. To experience healing, first you've got to "own it." This is exactly where many of us get into real trouble. Not only the sin itself is damaging, but our unwillingness to give it up--which is exactly what the Evil One wants: rationalize it, minimize it, not call it out for what it is. This way, things subtly and gradually get worse. We hardly notice until things have gotten really, really bad. We look around one day and discover that we are tied up in knots with seemingly no way to be set free--or worse, we live our whole lives and never notice why things are so bad, we just know that we feel unfulfilled, restless, depressed, and miserable. In turn, we make everyone around us miserable. This is not the way God intended us to live. We can make a different decision. We can become unbound through God's mercy.

What, then, is holding me bound? It could be many things, including bad habits, laziness, selfishness, anger issues, jealousy, lack of trust in God, lack of commitment to doing what is right, embarrassment, fear of admitting our failure, and other vices. Today, let's make a different decision. In this Guide, let us explore how we can be set free from all the evil that binds us.



Prayer

CONNECT with our GOD

- Let's start with the *The Sign of Cross*.
- As we gather to share our faith, ask the Holy Spirit to be present. Use your own words or offer a <u>Prayer to</u> the Holy Spirit.
- As someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday, listen to the Lord speaking to you.
- Listen to one other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the *Collect*—opening prayer of Sunday Mass.

Step One

Step Two

CONNECT with Scripture and Tradition

Choose from among the following Scriptures and teachings for reading, prayer, and discussion.

From the Points of Understanding:

- A vice is a habit acquired by repetition of the same sinful acts, making one more likely to sin again. (Grade 10–3.7.5) A virtue is the opposite: it's a habit of doing good so much it changes you.
- Sanctifying grace is the gratuitous gift of his life that God makes to all people through Jesus Christ; it is infused by the Holy Spirit into the soul to heal it of sin and to sanctify it. (Adult 3.3.42)

Discuss

- 1. Name something negative, unproductive, or sinful that you have a habit of doing OR name something you ought to do that you habitually neglect doing.
- 2. How could a change make a difference in your life? To whom can you turn to get support to make that change.

Practical Activities

For the Individual - Let Go List

Make a list of habits, beliefs, or situations you need to let go of (ex: regrets, fear, guilt). A **Let Go List** is something that can help when you are feeling stuck or stressed. You could start the day by asking God, "What do I need to let go of today?"



For Couples - Offer Forgiveness

Whether it is something big or the little that your spouse does that annoys you, offer him or her forgiveness. Take the time to work through things so that you do not become bound by anger or resentment. Ask God for the strength and the will to work through forgiveness together.



For the Domestic Church - Game Night Rotation


Make time in your busy schedule to have dinner and game nights as a family. Have a rotation on who leads the meal prayer and who gets to pick the game to play. Taking the time to share a meal and have some fun together helps create a special family bonds that last a lifetime.



Missionary Mindset - Help Make Rosaries

In the spirit of loosening the things that bind us to sin, we can tie "knots of prayer" instead. Consider making a rosary for yourself or as a gift for someone. The parish makes rosaries to send to people in jail and for others that need them. If you are interested in helping make some, contact Deacon Lolo at the parish office.

The holiest three days of the year--Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil, are coming soon. Not everyone can go to the Holy Land, but we can participate in the Church's sacred liturgies. It's like making a spiritual pilgrimage. Everyone should strive to participate in all three services at least once in a lifetime. Yes, they are long, but they are unlike anything else we do all year. It will move your heart!

Loosing of Sins

"What good would it have done Lazarus when he came out of the tomb, if it had not been said, 'Unbind him and let him go'? He came forth bound; not on his own feet, therefore, but by some power leading him. Let this be in the heart of the penitent: when you hear a man confessing his sins, he has already come to life again; when you hear a man lay his bare conscious in confessing, he has already come forth from the sepulcher; but he is not yet unbound. When is he unbound? By whom is he unbound? 'Whatever you loose on earth,' he says, 'shall be loosed in heaven.' Rightly is the loosing of sins able to be given by the Church, but the dead man cannot be raised to life again except by the Lord's calling him interiorly for this latter is done by God in a more interior way."

Word of the Week - Sanctifying Grace

Sanctifying grace is the gratuitous gift of his life that God makes to us; it is infused by the Holy Spirit into the soul to heal it of sin and to sanctify it. Although commonly associated with the possession of the virtue of charity, sanctifuing grace is yet distinct from this virtue. Charity, rather, belongs to the will, whereas sanctifying grace belongs to the whole soul, mind, will, and affections.






