


This Week

Renew and Re-invigorate

We continue to strive to bring you a substantive opportunity for you and your family to learn and grow in our Christian faith every week through these weekly Family Guides. Our first reading today from The Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47 has been an inspiration for us throughout this process. What we are inviting all the families of our parish into is not new, in fact it is ancient. "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles..." (Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47). For the past 9 ½ years, even before I arrived at Christ the Good Shepherd, the Holy Spirit had me praying for families in my morning holy hour, "Lord that families be brought closer together and, together, closer to God." What we are working toward here at Christ the Good Shepherd is the ministry of returning God to the very center of our lives as individuals, but most importantly, to the center of our families. We believe that happens by making God and the things of God a part of our daily conversations, certainly through prayer, but also in conversations and how our faith is related and guides decisions in our lives. They were so dedicated to this in the early church that "they would sell their property and possessions and dived them among all according to each one's need" (ibid). Our question this week is, 'How can we imitate the early Christian communities?' in fact, our prayer is that for all of us to renew and re-invigorate ourselves and our families in the faith of Jesus Christ. In the Gospel reading this week, John 20:19-31, Jesus says, "Peace be with you." May the peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.

CONNECT with our GOD

- As someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday, listen to the Lord speaking to you.
- Listen to one other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the *Collect*—opening prayer of Sunday Mass.



As there have been mini catechisms throughout church history and within some nations, the official Catechism of the Catholic Church was commissioned by Saint John Paul II and approved in 1992




