


## HELLO, CHRIST THE GOOD SHEPHERD FAMILY!

Welcome to our weekly CGS Guide that helps our parish families to grow in knowledge of the faith and deepen our relationship with Jesus as his disciples. As we encounter Jesus, we come to know him, love him, and serve him so that we can be reasonably happy in this life and happy with him forever in heaven.

## **Prayer**

In 1991, the bishops of the United States decided to permit different dioceses to make the decision to transfer the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord to the Seventh Sunday of Easter or to continue observing the feast on the Thursday before. The bishop of the then Diocese of Galveston-Houston, The Most Rev. Joseph A. Fiorenza, made the decision back then to transfer the feast in our diocese so that more of the faithful would be able to benefit from the observance of this beautiful mystery and truth of our faith. In our first reading today from The Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 the author, who is St. Luke, explain why he wrote both the Gospel and this treatise. "In the first book (the Gospel of St. Luke) I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught..." Then he proceeds to continue describing how the Resurrected Jesus appeared to the disciples and His mandate to them. In our Gospel this week, Matthew 28:16-20, Jesus says, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Mathew 28:16-20). How does prayer empower us to go and make disciples? What a wonderful question for all of us to consider during this Easter Season. Prayer keeps us connected to Christ. Prayer keeps us hungry to know more about the teachings of Jesus. Prayer keeps our souls connected to God through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. How are we bringing our own growing understanding of Jesus to our spouses and our families? How are we sharing our faith in Jesus with our children and others? Prayer is certainly about my own personal relationship with Jesus and my own personal spiritual growth. But prayer to God the Father, through Jesus Christ the Lord in the power of the Holy Spirit always brings up within us the gifts and talents that God gave us at the moment of our conception and that He asks us to grow into throughout our lives. Prayer empowers us to go out into the world. So, what are we waiting for?



#### **CONNECT** with our GOD through Prayer

- Let's start with the *The Sign of Cross*.
- As we gather to share our faith, ask the Holy Spirit to be present. Use your own words or offer a <u>Prayer to</u> the Holy Spirit.
- As someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday, listen to the Lord speaking to you.
- Listen to one other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the *Collect*--opening prayer of Sunday Mass.



#### What Makes us Catholic?

#### "A Church on the way out," Missionary by its Nature.

Pope Francis says, "All men, all women have a concern in their hearts, good and bad, but there is concern. Listen to those concerns. It does not say: 'Go and proselytize (or impose your beliefs). No no! Go and listen." Throughout successive addresses, on various occasions, the Pope has created his own vocabulary. He calls the Catholic Church. "Church that moves", "that opts for the last ones", "that goes to the periphery", "that comes out of itself," "that walks down the street" (to the 'street priests'), "Inclusive Church, "does not exclude", "not self-centered," not narcissistic, "that does not live for itself," "is not a notary," "entirely missionary Church," missionary disciple, "field hospital," refugee camp," the Church is not a NGO' etc. The Church on the way out, one who listens to the concerns of the people on the street, always with joy.

### Word of the Week - Missionary Disciple

A disciple is someone who receives instruction and is disciplined in a way of life. A missionary is someone who is sent somewhere with a specific purpose or mission. Thus, a missionary disciple is someone who is a follower of the Lord, does their best to obey all His commandments, growing in relationship by prayer, and goes out to tell others about Him. This is an ongoing process of prayer, learning, and sharing the Faith.
