Welcome Holy Spirit

HAPPY PENTECOST

What a wonderful gift the Father has sent us today! God's love has been poured into us through the Holy Spirit (CCC#733). Because of the Spirit, our whole being: mind, body, and soul are saturated by the great love of God. When we say "yes" to this love, we are transformed. Father David Michael Moses in his homily on May 16, 2023, referred to this transformation, "The Holy Spirit Christ-a-fies everything." We see this transformation throughout all of salvation history.

The Old Testament, beginning in Genesis we are formed by God and by the power of the breath of life (the Holy Spirit). We are 'Christ-a-fied' because we are formed in the image and likeness of our creator who is pure love. In the New Testament, Mary says yes to God, allowing the Holy Spirit to transform her. Mary is enveloped by Holy Spirit in love, becoming 'Christ- a- fied" and conceives Jesus. The Holy Spirit give her the gift of courage and responds, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoice in God my Savior." (Luke 1:46-47). Pentecost has come. Through wind and fire, He has blown away the old and placed a burning desire in our hearts. The apostles are 'Christ-a-fied' by the fire and gifts given from the Holy Spirit. All the baptized are 'Christ-a-fied' by the Holy Spirit, given their own gifts, and a burning desire to use those gifts for His glory. What gifts is the Holy Spirit calling you to use today?


CONNECT with our GOD through Prayer

- The first gift of every Christian existence is the Holy Spirit. It is not one of many gifts, but rather the fundamental Gift. The Spirit is the gift that Jesus had promised to send us. Without the Spirit there is no relationship with Christ and with the Father, because the Spirit opens our heart to God's presence and draws it into that "vortex" of love that is the very heart of God.
- (I)n each of us the Spirit composes original works, because there is never a Christian who is completely identical to another. In the infinite field of holiness, the one God, the Trinity of Love, makes the variety of witnesses flourish: all are equal in dignity, but also unique in the beauty that the Spirit has willed to emanate in each of those whom God's mercy has made his children.

What Makes us Catholic? The Seven Sacraments

The 7 Sacraments celebrated in the Catholic Church are Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Penance and Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders, and Matrimony. They are divided into three categories: Sacrament of Initiation, Sacraments of Healing, and Sacraments at the Service of Communion. The sacraments are special signs of God's love and presence, instituted by Jesus. The sacraments join Catholics all over the world with Jesus Christ and with one another. The 7 Sacraments are the most important celebrations of the Church. Each of the sacraments is a sign of God present in our lives.

Word of the Week - Sacraments

The sacraments are "efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us" (CCC 1131). In other words, a sacrament is a sacred and visible sign that is instituted by Jesus to give us grace, an undeserved gift from God and does what they say the will do. For example, in the Baptism Rite the celebrant says, "God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into his holy people." this is exactly what Baptism does.
