EVEN IF


A few years ago, my brother-in-law shared with me a tip on how to face fear. He said that often, fear comes to us as a "What if?" statement. For example, "What if I don't get that job? What if I don't have enough money? What if I don't get a good grade?"

He said the trick, is to change these into "Even if" statements. Instead of "What if I don't get that job?" we should say "Even if I don't get that job..." 

What are the fears keeping me from becoming the person God created me to be?


CONNECT with our GOD through Prayer

- Let's start with the *The Sign of Cross*.
- As we gather to share our faith, ask the Holy Spirit to be present. Use your own words or offer a <u>Prayer to</u> the Holy Spirit.
- As someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday, listen to the Lord speaking to you.
- Listen to one other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the *Collect*—opening prayer of Sunday Mass.

CONNECT with our daily LIVES

In today's gospel, Jesus says to the Twelve: "Fear no one."

Do we have fears because we are worried about what other people may think about us? Do we have fears because we are scared to upset people or situations? Do we have fears because we don't know the unknown?



CONNECT with Scripture and Tradition

- "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world" (John 16:33).

Under all trials, Christ has promised us his unwavering support and presence. This is why he tell us not to be afraid of anyone. How can we as individuals learn not be afraid in crucial moments for our sake and for the sake of others?

For the Individual

Examination of Self

Self-knowledge is important in order to reach self-acceptance and these two are important in order to reach self-gift. Journal or reflect on the fears in your life you may have. Go deeper as to why you have these and what the cause could be. Do all of this within prayer as to invite the Lord into it.



For Couples

Face Your Fears Together

Secret fears can sabotage a relationship. (Couples who are not married in the Church can be particularly vulnerable to the effects of fear.) Help one another identify and work through each others' fears; if needed, get counseling. Our parish offers Rejoice Counseling for individuals and families for a variety of issues and needs.



For the Domestic Church

What Would You Do?

Have a family conversation about what you should say or do when people make fun of your religious beliefs or try to undermine them in some way. Role play different scenarios. Talk about what it means to be courageous; as Jesus said, "Fear no one."



Missionary Mindset

Affirm Others

If you see other people struggling with a situation, affirm them that they can conquer and succeed. This can be a great way for other people to not be afraid. Your affirmation could be used as instrument of revealing God's plan for them. Let it be a way of trusting in God and affirming faith in him.

- As we finish, let us share a sign of peace with each other.




