Hearing with an Open Heart

...the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart. Hebrews 4:12

In September, my husband James and I will celebrate our 30th wedding anniversary. When we first met, it wasn't quite "love at first sight." I liked him, but due to the difference in our ages, I didn't readily consider dating him. Despite this, we began to have frequent conversations between us (I couldn't avoid him even if I wanted to, we lived in close proximity to each other and both of us attended daily Mass). Over time, we talked more and more often and for longer periods. We became lost in lively and intriguing discussions: two or three hours would go by, and we would still be talking! Both of us appreciated what the other had to say, and the more we listened to one another, the more we shared our beliefs, ideas, and convictions. He shared something of himself with me, and me with him. There was a fascination in getting to know each other. The more we learned about one another, the more we respected one another, and the closer we became. The intellectual exchange slowly became a heart exchange. I guess you could say he talked me into loving him! This gradual person-to-person interchange grew until I wanted to be with him more often. Then I wanted to be with him for the rest of my life.

Allowing myself encounter James in unfettered dialogue with him is the closest example of opening to God's Word I have experienced in my life. It was an easy exchange because I was open, willing, and interested in what he had to say. The God of all creation wants to have that kind of heart-to-heart talk with me and with you. God speaks, whether or not we are listening. God's Word always accomplishes it's goal one way or another. It is an honest question to ask whether or not we truly want to hear God's Word, what he wants to say to us. What attitudes do we have about hearing God's Word? Do we truly want to hear it, or do we minimize it or close ourselves off from it? Are we avoiding it for fear of what God may ask of us? Do we think what God has to say to us is worth hearing? Do we allow other voices to overcome his? In this week's Guide, let us prepare our hearts so we can be more open to God's Word and his will. He does want to be with us for the rest of our life.




How have I prepared my heart to receive God's Word?

CONNECT with our GOD through Prayer

- As someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday, listen to the Lord speaking to you.
- Listen to one other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the *Collect*--opening prayer of Sunday Mass.


Building Your Church at Home

I seek to hear from You today any correction, instruction or guidance. Give me wisdom to discern Your voice and act on it. In Jesus Name I pray. Amen.



WE ARE THE CHURCH



The four types of persons envisaged in the Parable of the Sower are (1) those who never accept the word of the kingdom (Mt 13:19); (2) those who believe for a while but fall away because of persecution (Mt 13:20-21); (3) those who believe, but in whom the word is choked by worldly anxiety and the seduction of riches (Mt 13:22); (4) those who respond to the word and produce fruit abundantly (Mt 13:23). (source, footnote).

Catholics believe that we cannot be saved without God's initiative; however, we also believe that salvation involves our free acceptance and participation in it. We can grow in grace and holiness, becoming more beautiful for God by our attitude and choices.

Word of the Week - Contempation

Contemplation is to look lovingly at God for an extended time. Contemplation starts when we entrust ourselves to God, in whatever way God chooses to approach us. It is up to God, not up to us. It is his work in us. God is willing to touch and transform us to be like him. God wants to lead us to be united in love with him, so that we may live in his loving presence. This flow of divine love slowly and gradually changes us. It empties us of our limited and imperfect human ways of thinking, loving, and behaving, transforming them into divine ways. To contemplate God's Word is to open ourselves to be transformed by it. **Learn more.**



The Word of God in Texas

In the 1840's, missionary priests came from France to minister to the Alsatian Catholics in the newly-established community of Castroville, located in what was then the Republic of Texas.

In 1847, at the age of 29, Fr. Claude Marie Dubuis was assigned to be the first pastor of St. Louis Catholic Church (he was later appointed second bishop of Texas).
