The good, the bad and the ugly in the Kingdom of Heaven


How many times do we start something such as a personal, family, pastoral or ministerial project, and we do not see "progress" or some kind of fruit? Or even worse, while you are trying to do the work of God, living the best possible way, doing something good, you meet someone who hurts you or one of your loved ones by lying or defaming or even causing physical or psychological damage and you wonder... Why does this or that happen? Why does God allow bad things to happen to good people?

Today we read or hear in the Gospel this passage that begins with the parable of the weeds but then introduces two additional parables: that of the mustard seed and that of the leaven. It then resumes, explains, and closes the initial parable of the weeds.

The parables of St. Matthew's Gospel this Sunday invite us to trust in the process even when we do not see fruits or when things are not advancing or improving. It invites us to not to be discouraged or disappointed in our walk in God's path when we encounter bad or evil things that are against us and can lead us to doubt whether what we are doing is from and for God. The parables of the mustard seed and the leaven present us in contrast an insignificant beginning and the greatness of its development. That is, it doesn't matter how small it seems at the beginning or at the present time or how slow it goes, it is happening and will manifest itself in a total and surprising way.

The first parable presents us with two seeds: one that comes from God and the other that comes from the devil. These two subsist while the Kingdom of God is introduced. It is not for us to judge, but for God himself who at the end, will separate one from the other. The Kingdom of Heaven grows and develops despite any evil in our midst. So, trust, God is in control, even if sometimes it doesn't seem like it.



Venerable Bishop Fulton Sheen

Bishop Fulton Sheen was one of the most popular people on radio and television in the 1950's-1970's, smartly taking advantage of the new medium of television to spread the Word of God. He was entertaining, funny, provocative, and deeply in love with our Lord Jesus Christ. In many ways, he was a prophet: pointing people to the truth—especially the truth within the the context of our own culture and our own times. In this short video, he speaks of the denigration in our society—words he spoke over 50 years ago that could just have well been televised today. May we listen to the wise words of Catholic teachers among us so that we may build and not destroy as we *build up* the Kingdom of God.






