


Welcome

This Week

Take Courage, It is I!

Today's gospel is Matthew's account of Jesus calming the storm at sea. This event must have impressed itself strongly on the minds of the disciples because the story is told in all four gospels. This is not surprising, because fear is a common and very much shared element in human life; it is something to which we can all relate. When Peter cries out: "Lord, save me!" he is probably desperate and scared because Jesus remarks about his lack of faith. Mind you, this is the same boatload of disciples who just hours earlier had seen Jesus feed a huge crowd with five loaves of bread and two fish! They had seen what he can do, and yet they didn't think he would do so great a thing for them. How very much are we like those first followers of Jesus. Time and time again we have seen God's Providence in our lives, and over and over again God must remind us that he is still here and he still cares. Jesus authority over the sea reveals Him as one who is not asleep or silent when we are facing the storms of our life. He says to our souls, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Jesus understands, and he provides the counterbalance: have faith; but not just faith in anything—have faith in God who always has our best interests in mind. There is only one way to grow in faith—to be in situations in which we have no control, we don't get to pre–plan the outcome, we don't get a vote, and we are utterly dependent on God to see us through. Like all storm-ridden disciples, we have one of two choices: fear or trust. On the Sea of Galilee that night, the disciples didn't do such a great job trusting in Jesus, though in time, walking with him, they learned to trust the Lord, and so can we. Those same cowardly men later gave their lives for Christ and for the sake of the gospel message we receive today. In this week's CGS FAMILY Guide, let us consider the ways we need to grow in faith so we can pass this message of trust and hope to the next generation.







What Makes us Catholic? Assumption of Mary

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity.




