

This Week

The Answer is Close at Hand

In this Sunday's gospel, we continue reading from the 13th chapter of St. Matthew where Jesus tells parables about what he calls "The Kingdom of Heaven." Earlier in Matthew (4:17) Jesus begins his public ministry with a message. What is the very first thing he says when as he begins to speak to the people? "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." If Jesus leads with this, it must be very important. It is the basis on which he builds everything else. Clearly, he goes on to speak of this "Kingdom" in varies ways: each example and story is meant to lead us to a greater understanding of the truth. Jesus is leading us to what will fill our hearts with peace if we are willing to listen, accept, and obey. Through this Sunday's parables and many others, Jesus tells us to "repent;" that is to be sorry for what we have done wrong, to turn away from sin and turn toward him; to stop the mad dash towards things that never fully satisfy us. He tells us to do this because the thing our hearts want most is a fingertip away: the Kingdom of Heaven "is at hand;" it is very close to us, it is among us and within us. What keeps us from touching it, and allowing it to touch us? Fear, selfishness, greed, laziness, pride, injustice, and foolishness of all kinds. It's simple, really; yet it is the task of a lifetime to achieve, and remains wholly unachievable without the grace and mercy of God.

In what ways do you desire peace, freedom, and joy in your life? How are you suffering from uneasiness, discontent, and spiritual longing? The answer is close at hand, though it requires our assent and our participation. The Kingdom will not be forced upon us; it is being offered to us. Our Lord declares: "Whoever has ears ought to hear." Are we listening? Are we willing? In this week's Guide, let us explore: "What am I willing to do to receive the Kingdom of Heaven?"

- 3. Jesus concludes his message in this parable by saying, "Whover has ears ought to hear." We all have ears, it's true--so what is it, do you think, that Jesus wants us to hear?

What Makes us Catholic? The Beatific Vision

Beatific Vision, the immediate knowledge of God which the angelic spirits and the souls of the just enjoy in Heaven. It is called "vision" to distinguish it from the mediate knowledge of God which the human mind may attain in the present life. And since in beholding God face to face the created intelligence finds perfect happiness, the vision is termed "beatific".

Word of the Week - Laity

Laity comes from the Greek word "laikos," which means "of the people" and "laos," which means just "people." The lay faithful are not exempt from a religious vocation. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (897), the laity "are made sharers in their particular way in the priestly, prophetic, and kingly office of Christ" through their baptisms." Laity have a special vocation "to seek the kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and directing them according to God's will" (CCC, 898).






