This Week

## **Heaven Changes Everything**

In our Gospel for this week, Jesus takes three of his most loved apostles, Peter, James and John, up to the mountain top. This mountain top, Mount Tabor, carries deep spiritual symbolism, representing a place of revelation, divine presence and a joining of heaven and earth and the apostle experience all of this. Seeing Moses and Elijah conversing with Jesus Christ, the fulfillment of both the prophets and the law; experiencing the answered prayers of Elijah and Moses to see God; witnessing the majesty of Christ, the living Son of God, before his death and resurrection; and the event climaxes with the voice of the Father saying to listen to my beloved Son. No wonder why Peter wanted to erect tents and stay on the mountain top – who wouldn't want to stay in a place where heaven and earth have met. Instead, Jesus leads them down the mountain for, there is much to do and little time to get it done.

We are so lucky; at every Mass we attend heaven and earth are joined together. We hear our salvation history from the prophets and the apostles; we pray with angels and saints in worship of our living God; Jesus becomes present at the altar and feeds us with himself. How much closer to heaven could we be; how much closer could we be to God? A friend of mine, who is of another Christian faith tradition, ask me, "If you believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, and he is always at the church, how could you leave and not stay at the church with him?" After prayer and reflection, I discovered the answer – we leave because of this Gospel.

At the end of each Mass, we are dismissed to spread the Good News. As Christ' living church, each of us are sent forth to help others know him. As Saint Peter tells us, "(W)e possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable. You will do well to be attentive to it, as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts." 2 Peter 1:19 We leave because Jesus leads us down the mountain, for there is much to do and little time to get it done.



# What Makes us Catholic? The Mass

The English word "Mass" comes from the Latin word missa, which means to be "sent." This Latin word has been used since the 6th or 7th century to describe the Catholic celebration of the Eucharist, our main liturgical service. The word is used during the conclusion of the celebration, when the priest or deacon says in Latin, Ite, missa est. The literal translation of that phrase is, "Go, it has been sent." Pope Benedict XVI also expanded on these words in his encyclical <u>Sacramentum Caritatis</u>, but focused on a different spiritual meaning behind the phrase. He wrote, "In antiquity, missa simply meant 'dismissal.' However in Christian usage it gradually took on a deeper meaning. The word 'dismissal' has come to imply a 'mission.' These few words succinctly express the missionary nature of the Church. The People of God might be helped to understand more clearly this essential dimension of the Church's life, taking the dismissal as a starting-point." (aleteia.org)



#### Word of the Week - Mandorla

Mandorla, (Italian: "almond"), in religious art, almond-shaped aureole of light surrounding the entire figure of a holy person; it was used in Christian art usually for the figure of Christ. By the 6th century the mandorla had become a standard attribute of Christ in scenes of the Transfiguration, in which Christ shows himself to his Apostles transformed into his celestial appearance.
