

This Week

Are You a Brave Soul?

This week's Guide is for those brave souls who dare to take a closer look at themselves with honesty about the things that may be keeping them from a closer and deeper relationship with Jesus, and therefore keeping them from a richer and more fulfilling life. Each of us have our own particular faults and struggles, though all of the possible reasons why we haven't yet allowed God to accomplish good in us comes down to some basic root causes: pride, greed, unjust anger, lust, jealosy, laziness, and habitual excess in eating or consuming goods—otherwise known as the "seven deadly sins" that get us into trouble every single time. In Galatians 5:19–21 reads: "Now the works of the flesh are obvious: immorality, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, resentment, acts of selfishness, dissensions, divisions, occasions of envy, drinking bouts, orgies, and the like." That's quite a list! In contrast, "...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Galatians 5:22). These are they key to human flourishing.

So, brave soul, are we willing to look at ourselves honestly and seek out those ways in which our thoughts and behaviors are preventing Jesus from accomplishing His mission in us? Some examples we might consider (though there are many others):

- What immature ways has Jesus invited me to leave behind?
- How have I failed to forgive others?
- How am I failing to take responsibility for the bad things I have done and the good I ought to do?
- In what ways has God revealed his will to me and how am I rebelling against that in favor of my own preferences?
- What are the biggest time wasters in my life and how are they keeping me from becoming a better, holier person?
- What vices (bad habits) am I clinging to that are causing decay in my soul?



Question of the Week

CONNECT with our GOD through Prayer

- Let's start with the *The Sign of Cross*.
- As we gather to share our faith, ask the Holy Spirit to be present.
 Use your own words or offer a <u>Prayer to the Holy Spirit</u>.
- As someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday, listen to the Lord speaking to you.
- Listen to one other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the *Collect*—opening prayer of Sunday Mass.






