EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

WE ARE KNOWN BY OUR FRUIT

This week, Jesus tells us that we must examine our own inner selves, our attitudes and dispositions, virtues and faults, rather than judging others. What is in our hearts comes out in what and how we speak. If our hearts are filled with kindness and compassion, those qualities will be evident in our speaking, just as beautiful, wholesome fruit comes only from healthy trees. And vice-versa. The Wisdom writer Sirach in the first reading agrees with this concept—that we will be judged by our words. Paul reminds us that the reward of discipleship is eternal life. Today's psalm of thanksgiving and praise reminds us of God's kindness and faithfulness, which we are to emulate in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We are known, each of us, by our own fruit.

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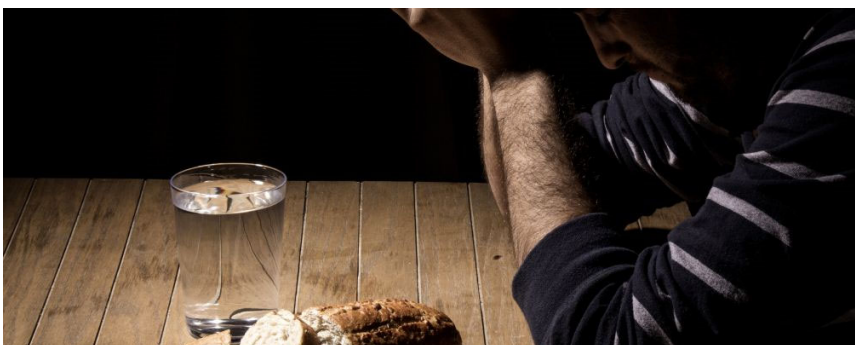

HOLY FACE OF JESUS

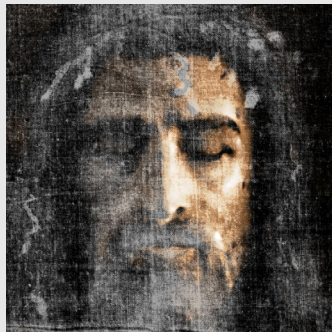
The Devotion to the Holy Face was revealed by Jesus to Sr. Marie of St. Peter (1816-1848) a Carmelite nun of Tours in France. The primary purpose of the devotion is to make reparation for sins against the first three commandments: **Denial of God, Blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days.**

The Feast of the Holy Face of Jesus

(established throughout the universal Church in 1958 by Pope Pius XII, to be observed on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday) is a beautiful and precious opportunity to make reparation for the outrages that the Holy Face of Jesus received during His Passion, and which He continues to receive daily in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Our Lord Himself requested this moving devotion by which the faithful unite themselves with Him in His sorrow through special acts of reparation to His Holy Face.

On the first Friday of Lent in 1936, Our Lord appeared to Sister (later Mother) Maria Pierina de Micheli, He said to her: **"I desire that My Face, which reflects the deep anguish of My Soul, and the sorrow and love of My Heart, be more honored! He who contemplates Me, consoles Me..."**

On Tuesday of Passion



Week of that same year, Our Lord again requested that souls meditate upon His Holy Face:

"Each time My Face is contemplated I will pour My Love into hearts, and through My Holy Face, many souls will be saved."

Our Lord also dictated the following prayer to Sr Mary of Peter, saying that it would heal the injuries inflicted by the impious. The sin of blasphemy, Our Lord revealed, grievously offends Him. By blasphemy the sinner curses Him to His Face, attacks Him openly, annuls redemption, and pronounces his own condemnation.

"May the most Holy, most Sacred, most Adorable, Most Incomprehensible and Ineffable Name of God Be always Praised, Blessed, Loved, Adored and Glorified, In Heaven, on Earth and under the Earth, By all the Creatures of God, And by the Sacred Heart of Our Lord Jesus Christ, In the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Amen."

HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HOLY MASS

PART 7

"It strikes you to see me a little further behind Monsignor, right? This is how it should be... With all that My Son loves Me, He has not given Me the dignity that He gives to a priest of being able to carry it in My hands daily, as priestly hands do. That is why I feel such deep respect for a priest and for all the miracle that God performs through him, that it forces me to kneel here" Our Lady said.

My God, how much dignity, how much grace the Lord pours out on priestly souls and neither we, nor perhaps many of them are aware! In front of the altar, shadows of people in gray began to emerge, raising their hands upwards. Said the Blessed Virgin: **"They are the blessed souls in Purgatory who are waiting for your prayers to refresh themselves. Don't stop praying for them. They ask for you, but they cannot ask for themselves, it is you who have to ask for them to help them go out to meet God and enjoy Him eternally."**

"You see, I am here all the time... People make pilgrimages and look for the places of My apparitions, and it is good for all the graces that are received there, but in no apparition, nowhere am I more present than any other. in the Holy Mass. At the foot of the Altar where the Eucharist is celebrated, you will always find Me; At the foot of the Tabernacle I remain with the Angels, because I am always with Him".

Seeing that beautiful face of the Mother at that moment of the "Holy", like all of them, with a shining face, with hands together waiting for that miracle that is continually repeated, was to be in heaven itself. And to think that there are people who can be distracted at that moment, talking... I say it with pain, many more men than women, who cross their arms standing up, as if paying homage to the Lord, as equals. The Virgin said: **"Tell the human being that a man is never more of a man than he is when he bends his knees before God".**

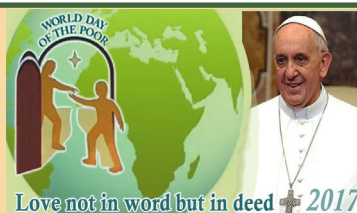

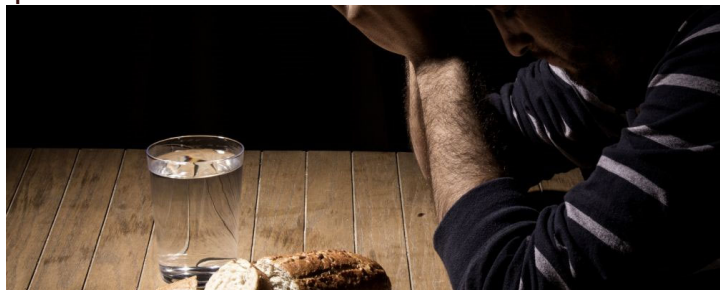
