#### 'Tis the Season

It was refreshing this year to witness several big department stores refuse to open on Thanksgiving. In the past few years, stores have opened earlier and earlier and it was feared that individuals would forgo Thanksgiving entirely, in an effort to get an earlier start on shopping.

We know the true meaning of Christmas in our hearts, but it is also the season when the consumption of "stuff" rules. Just go to a retail shopping area and you will see that it is not love that is all around us, but stuff to buy. Everywhere we look is encouragement to buy, wear, eat, drink, and party. We all know that despite finances for many people being very precarious, the message to consume is strong and creates a whole wave of anxiety and pressure that for some is literally intolerable.

You can't change the culture but you can change your actions. Buying gifts for loved ones is appropriate; the key is to keep it simple and meaningful. Think of several friends or family members you have exchanged gifts with. Do you remember what they gave you for Christmas last year or what they gave them? Try to find the most thoughtful gifts instead of the most hyped or expensive and they will be remembered and your love will be communicated each time your gifts are used.

It is imperative to also slow down. It is difficult to celebrate this time as a spiritual season if you're in a constant whirl of activities—parties, shopping, and luncheons. Minimize the anxiety that many people (especially women) feel by separating what you have control over from what you don't. Decide what you have to do, what you want to do and what others expect you to do, and get rid of those that doesn't fit into the first two categories.

Celebrate all of the Christmas season. Don't stop on December 25 as the secular season fizzles out. Plan some of your Christmas-season socializing with family and friends after Christmas Day. In your own family, find appropriate celebrations for the liturgical feasts of the season.

#### Reflection for the 4th Week of Advent

Yes, it's almost here! One week from today and we will be immersed in Christmas celebrations.

With one more week and with the plethora of events which seem to crowd this time of year, today might be a day to ask ourselves, How have I been preparing for this day? Has the Christmas music helped me to remember what Dec 25<sup>th</sup> is really about? Have my efforts to choose the right gifts for family and friends been an act of love? What has happened to me and for me during this Advent season.

I have had a hard time this year jumping into Advent, which is usually a very special time of the Church year for me. I don't know why this is happening but I'm sure it's an invitation to something God is trying to tell me. I do know that when I enter our church, with the Advent decorations, and listen to the Advent Scriptures proclaimed, I feel immersed in another reality: It's Advent, my heart says: I am grateful for the Church that calls us to take time to prepare, to reflect on what this Feast means.

Today's Gospel tells us about the events in the life of Mary and Joseph which changed the course of human history, from a Christian perspective. They, too, waited for a coming which would change their lives. They waited with concern, with some anxiety, but also with trust in a God they knew to be faithful and who had called them to a special role in the life of Israel. I find Joseph to be a person who gets too little press in the Scriptures. We know very little. For me Joseph is a truly inspiring figure. As we come to the end of this time of preparation, may we, too, find it in our hearts to allow God to call us, to invite us, to a life of discipleship and service. To a life of love which our Savior modeled for us.
