Pastor's Corner

Beloved,

As we celebrate Independence Day, I want to deviate from my series on the liturgy and talk about our nation and the meaning of freedom.

Most of you know that I am a United States Veteran. I served my country proudly and would do so again. I believe in this country and what it stands for. I know that we are a country made up of human beings and so our country is fallible. We make mistakes. We too often fall prey to the predators of bigotry and greed. But because we are a free society, we will always be reminded by those prophets among us who call us to be better. Who encourage us to be the "one nation, under God" that we are called to be.

We are a nation committed to the concept of freedom. And, freedom is a commitment to the concept of truth. To believe a lie is to be a slave to the one who lies. To promulgate a lie is to seek to enslave others. Freedom is the opposite of anarchy. Anarchy is the lie that my own desires and opinions are more important than the truth. It is, in fact, the original lie spoken by the serpent to our first parents, "You shall be as gods." Or, more precisely, "You shall be your own god."

Sexual Abuse

- 1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
- 2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911,
- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500 or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
