



The Pope also wrote an apostolic letter dedicated to St. Joseph entitled, *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart").



Pastor's Corner

Beloved,

There is no doubt that Christ's love is amazing. He overlooks our faults and sees only the good and beauty he created within us. He reaches out to us and invites us to come into his inner circle of friends (saints), accepting us just the way we are. By this simple act of love, he also calls us to be transformed now into that fellowship of saints, to be bright lights shining in a dark world. Yes, Christ's love is amazing.

Our response to that love is called reverence. Often, reverence is confused with outward trappings of dress, posture, or demeanor. All of those can be important, but they are not reverence. Reverence comes from deep within.

Reverence is more an internal attitude than outward appearance. It is an attitude of submission, of love, and of joy. We kneel as a symbol of submission to Christ's authority over the Church and our lives. We sing as an outward expression of the joy that fills our hearts. We greet one another in peace as an act of love for Christ who lives in each of God's adopted children.

The outward appearance of reverence is only as important as what is internal. If there is no heartfelt love, joy, or submission, the outward is just hypocrisy. And when our knees are too shot to kneel, or our bodies too weak to rise in greeting, still our hearts are full of love for our Savior and his people as we reverently gather to worship him.

- 1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
- 2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911,
- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500 or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
