There is no better time than the Advent Season to encounter Jesus Christ and to move to a better place, to experience a new beginning. Advent, in Latin, means "coming." The Advent season is a time for "getting ready" for the celebration of Christmas. It is the preparation for God's gift, the coming of Jesus into the world.

During the Advent season we gather around the Advent wreath, we think and pray with our families and pray for our loved ones, we pray for others in our community and we think of ways in which we may help those less fortunate. As we light the candles on the Advent wreath we anticipate the celebration of the birth of Jesus – Christmas Day.

St. Daniel the Stylite Priest 409-493 AD December 11

Daniel was born in Maratha, Syria in 409 and became a monk in nearby Samosata on the Upper

Euphrates. He learned of Saint Simeon Stylite the Elder, living on top of a pillar at Antioch and went to see him twice.

At the age of forty-two, Daniel decided that he too wanted to become a stylite (from the Greek word "stylos", meaning pillar) and live on top of a pillar at a Constantinople. spot near Therefore, Emperor Leo I, built a pillar with a platform on top for him, and Daniel was ordained there by St. Gennadius. The saint quickly became an attraction for the people. He celebrated the Eucharist on his pillar, preached sermons, dispensed spiritual advice, and cured the sick who were brought up to him. He also gave prudent counsel to Emperors Leo and Zeno and the patriarch of Constantinople. Exposed to the sun, wind, rain and elements, all Daniel lived while. particular type of "pillar spirituality." He came down from his perch only once in thirty-three years to turn Emperor Baliscus away backing the heresy of from Monophysitism.

Daniel died in 493 and became the best known Stylite after St. Simeon Stylite the Elder. The life of St. Daniel the Stylite is an apt reminder that there are many ways to live the spiritual life. All of us have our own way to be close to God every day. Our task is to find that way and follow it to the very end.
