WHAT HAPPENS AT MASS? - THE ASSEMBLY*-Anthony Rosselli, Director of Evangelization*

There are more people at Mass than those in the pews. The Greek word for "church" is *ekklesia*—"the assembly." But who is it that's being assembled? Arriving, you might look around and see the normal congregation: Bob and Kathy are where they should be. The cantors are setting up. "It's just us," you might suppose, settling in.

It most certainly is not.

Mass is an assembly of a particular parish community—it is true. But they are the minority of those attending. That is the ancient understanding of the Mass. You can hear it if you listen to what's being prayed, especially when the priest consecrates the bread and wine. "With the Angels," he says, "and all the Saints we declare your glory." That's an extraordinary number to be alongside. But are they actually somehow *here*?

The priest goes on to pray about how the Mass takes place, "in communion with...the glorious ever-Virgin Mary...and blessed Joseph, her Spouse." Evidently Joseph and Mary are here. He says the "blessed Apostles and Martyrs" are here. In the long form of the prayer, the priest mentions "Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus, Cornelius, Cyprian, Lawrence, Chrysogonus, John and Paul, Cosmas and Damian." Apparently they—whoever they are—are all here. A lot of these guys were old martyred popes. All of them have been dead for hundreds of years.

If you glance at the sanctuary's Easter Candle, emblazoned starkly on its front will be the present year. Your watch will read the present time. What are Linus and Cletus—the second and third popes from nearly two thousand years ago—doing here?

The vision at Mass contracts at one moment upon our particular time and place, but then it expands. It is local, then universal. You sit down at first and think "it's just us." Here are "my people." It's just you and your spouse and your kids and your community. You have brought with you the burdens of *this* morning. But then the vision expands and, somehow, Mary is here. Somehow, the angels are here. Somehow, Linus and Cletus and every other pope is here.

The Greek word for "church" is *ekklesia*—"the assembly." But who is being "assembled"? The Irish Catholic writer James Joyce had his own definition for the Church: "Here comes everybody." Joyce meant something else entirely, but he was more right, perhaps, than he imagined. The Eucharistic Prayer says the Mass is offered in the presence of "all the saints," with those "who have pleased [God] throughout the ages". That's not just Linus and company. That means, as we said, that there are *far* more people at Mass than those in the pews. So settle in. It's just us. It's just Mary, Joseph, a few thousand angels and saints. It's just everybody.

The consultation process will continue throughout 2022 until final models are approved. No decisions have been made regarding any parish, and none will be made until feedback is gathered directly from parishioners through the consultation process.

A NOTE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Our Lady of Peace Family,

With the start of the school year have come a number of funerals being held over at the church. This may sound morbid, but one of my favorite reasons for working in a Catholic school is the fact that our day and routine is sometimes inconvenienced by these end-of-life important services.

The old wives' tale says that death comes in series of three. That happens frequently here. We will go months without a funeral and then have two or three or four within a week or two.

Funerals are typically held around 10am. Sometimes there is visitation before the service begins. In pre-covid days there would sometimes be luncheons held in the church space (lovingly referred to as the old rectory). At some funerals, there is not a parking spot to be found and the procession to the graveyard can take many minutes to organize and begin.

Cars in the parking lot interfere with recess. If the weather is good, we hustle students over to the field and back. If the field is too wet or snow covered, we lose outside recess for funerals, and that is more than just okay with me, not because I prefer indoor recess to out but because funerals are as much a part of parish life as baptisms, weddings, weekly All School and Sunday Masses.

Fairly soon, Father Dooley is returning altar servers to our liturgies. In the past, our students would be called upon to serve at funerals, missing some class time for it. I look forward to that resuming. That is more than just okay with me. Our Lady of Peace Parish gives so much to our school, including money to run the place, that giving back whenever and wherever we can is entirely appropriate.

One of the limitations of our parish is the lack of a large gathering space. As I mentioned, some funeral crowds are big and a luncheon after a funeral can be very comforting as family and friends of the deceased break bread together.

I have proposed to Father Dooley that we allow funeral luncheons to be held in our school cafeteria. At those times, the cafeteria can serve a brown bag lunch and students can eat in their classrooms or in the gym. It is not that we ask students to interact with guests or dwell on the death of someone they don't know, but a parish is like a small town. In times of both need and celebration, we want to be all together in assisting when we can and how we can.

I was reminded of this just a few months ago in April when my father passed away. I knew that there would be many people at the funeral and his home parish, Our Lady of Victory, is fairly small. If you recall, even Sunday Masses weren't back to normal then and so I asked Father Dooley if I could have the funeral here knowing that attendees would have a little more space. Father graciously agreed.

The parking lot was full that day and it took a long time for the funeral procession to St. Joseph Cemetery to get organized and on the road, so recess was impacted that day for sure (the school didn't make me do recess duty that day!) It was so comforting to have my Dad's funeral at the place where I work and where I was married and where some of my grandchildren were baptized. Some day, hopefully not soon, my own funeral service will be here and that brings comfort to me. I know that must be true for the family of our parishioners to say goodbye in the same space where their loved ones attended Mass and maybe even school!

As we come out (hopefully sooner than later) of this pandemic, we over at 40 E. Dominion want to be of more service to 20 E. Dominion. Besides altar serving, we do Keep Christ in Christmas with the Knights and make sandwiches twice a month for St. Vincent DePaul. Our students cantor at Mass. Some of our students and families assist on beautification days and many work the Church festival. Parish life is about a person's whole life, and of their death, and Our Lady of Peace School is and must always be a part of Our Lady of Peace Parish.

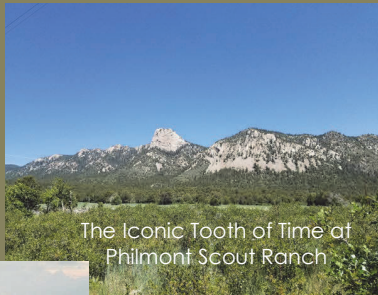
A Summer of Scouting – Troop 169 - Summer 2021

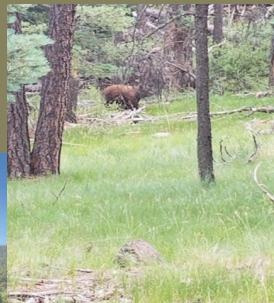

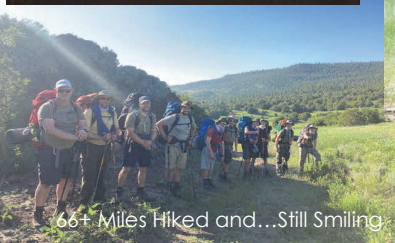

+ Wilderness First Aid and CPR

Philmont requires that we have 2 crew members Wilderness First Aid and CPR trained. Why? When you camp in the backcountry at Philmont, you are very remote. If someone needs help, it may be a longer wait time. So, we had to be prepared. We set learned how to care for someone quickly and get the professional help they need...we even set up a

landing zone in the case of a air evacuation. What an experience!



+ Helping Our Parish, School and Community

We now have five Scouts working on the rank of Eagle Scout. One requirement is to complete a community service project. This is not just any project. Scouts must plan, organize, raise funds, manage and lead a project that helps their community. Some of our Scouts are helping or plan to help their OLP faith community. Others are helping other Catholic organizations or other communities around Columbus.





Scout Helps Children in His Community!

Children born with Cortical Blindness can learn to see when provided special training devices. This is what Sebastian Fast, a Scout in Troop 169, found when he was looking for ideas for his Eagle Project. In order to earn the Eagle Rank, Scouts must lead and complete a project in their community. It's a huge commitment, but Sebastian was ready and was looking for an opportunity to help.

Sebastian worked with staff from the Ohio State School for the Blind on plans to build "Stay-Put Playstations". These stations help babies with Cortical Blindness to develop visual ability by training their brain. These babies *can* see, but their brain cannot properly process what the eyes are seeing.

After learning more about what was needed to build these devices, Sebastian went to work and developed a plan. An Eagle Project must be detailed and comprehensive. Sebastian completed his plan and, after it was approved, he worked on gathering donations and supplies. Scouts must lead others in completing the project and that is exactly what Sebastian did to complete 12 "Stay-Put Playstations".

Sebastian completed his project and is now an Eagle Scout, and that is a huge accomplishment. However, it is the results of his Eagle Project that will be an accomplishment that will affect many children and families for years to come.

Sebastian learned so much from Scouting....he learned that, no matter your age, you can do big things and help others in a big way. ~
