### First Reading: Acts 7:55-60

### From the Desk of Fr. Jared Memorial Day

This weekend as we enjoy the freedoms that we have in all the different ways we do, let us remember to honor and pray for all those men and women who fought for that freedom, and for those who continue to fight for our freedom. Let us always remember to show great respect for the flag of our nation under which so many men and women died. Our nation is under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception. ### Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

This Thursday, May 30, is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. The Church observes this day as if it is a Sunday and therefore invites us to celebrate Eucharist (attend Mass) on this day as it does on Sunday. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. It is important for us to celebrate these special holy days because they provide a rhythm and a structure for us to enter into the mysteries of the Lord throughout the liturgical year. It is a reminder of the centrality of our faith to "interrupt" the normal routine during the week by celebrating an important liturgical day.

We celebrate this day forty days after Easter. This comes to us from the Acts of the Apostles. The meaning of the Ascension is spelled out for us throughout the readings and prayers of the liturgy. The two Prefaces (the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer) that can be chosen at the Mass say: "Mediator between God and man, judge of the world and Lord of hosts, he ascended. not to distance himself from our lowly state but that we, his members, might be confident of following where, he, our Head and Founder, has gone before" and "For after his Resurrection he plainly appeared to all his disciples and was taken up to heaven in their sight, that he might make us sharers in his divinity." Notice how both texts point out how the Lord's Ascension is not about his absence, but his deeper presence to us and how we are invited to share more fully in the mystery of his life. Keep these thoughts in mind as you celebrate Mass on the Holy Day this week.

The book placed on the altar as Mass begins is the Book of the Gospels and it is used for the proclamation of the Gospel. The Book at the ambo is the Lectionary and is used for the readings. They are used for the first part of the Mass – the Liturgy of the Word. The other book used at Mass is the Roman Missal. The Missal tells the priest what to do and say.
