Scripture Readings November 17, 2019 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20a

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of "the sun of justice, with its healing rays," believed by most to mean Jesus.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because "by patient endurance you will save your lives." If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected and their suffering will end.

Mass of Remembrance

Thank you to everyone who participated in last week's Mass of Remembrance. I would like to extend a special thank you to the Par-Troy Funeral Home, Norman Dean Funeral Home, and Dangler Lewis and Carey Funeral Home for sponsoring the reception that followed the Mass of Remembrance. Throughout the month of November, we continue to pray for all of our beloved dead. The names of your loved ones which you provided have been placed by the Baptismal Font along with the *Book of the Dead* and will be remembered throughout the month of November at all of the Masses.

Adult Faith Enrichment

On Tuesday, November 19, we will have a presentation on how we as Catholics approach and experience death, as well as how we celebrate funeral rites. Serratelli wrote a Pastoral Letter on this topic in 2014. In it he stated, "Today, we are beginning to witness a minimizing and even elimination of rituals surrounding death and burial. An increasing number of Catholics are breaking away from traditional Catholic funerals." (7) "Nonetheless, death still remains a reality and must be faced. Catholic funeral rites offer the bereaved a needed time to grieve and to strengthen their faith. They offer those left behind a way to face death by celebrating life in Christ. They provide a needed moment to affirm the basic truths of faith at a painful moment. When the rites are followed, they offer a faith-filled way to find meaning, to remember and to pray for the deceased and to move forward with hope." (13)

The presenter will be Fr. Michael Whalen, CM. Fr. Whalen is a Vincentian priest who teaches Sacramental and Liturgical Theology at St. John's University. In addition, he has keen insights into the spiritual life. There will be two presentations: the first is at 4 pm and the same presentation will be given again at 7:30 pm. Both presentations will be held in the Parish Center. Please sign up for one presentation in the back of church.
