

#### FROM FATHER FRAN:



As we continue our "bread of life" summer gospel readings, this is a great time to thank all the members of our parish Eucharistic Bread Baking Ministry, led by Fay DiNitto. Thank you all for your dedication and the care with which you bake the bread we bless and share during the celebration of the Eucharist.

With the church's discipline of using unleavened bread at the Eucharist, our bakers will tell you how much of a challenge it is to mix only wheat and water and come out with a worthy loaf of bread!

The tradition of unleavened bread has not always pervaded our Eucharistic history. In fact, even now the Eastern Catholic churches allow for a more expansive recipe. For those with wheat allergies, the Roman Catholic Church provides for the use of low gluten hosts. (At St. Matthias we always have low gluten hosts on hand. Just come into the sacristy before Mass and request a low gluten host from one of the Eucharistic ministers.)

The western use of unleavened bread reflects the feeling by some scripture scholars that the meal we call Jesus' "last supper" took place at a Jewish Passover meal, during which unleavened bread was always consumed, reflecting the haste with which the Israelites were to prepare to leave the bonds of slavery in Egypt.

A different interpretation of the last supper comes to us from St. John's gospel. The author sets the scene, not within the context of the Passover meal, but on the evening before the Passover, at the hour when the lambs used for the Passover sacrifice were killed, thus interpreting Jesus last meal as foreshadowing the sacrifice of his life as the Lamb of God.

In fact, the Gospel according to John does not even include an account of the blessing of bread and wine at the meal. For the author of the fourth gospel, Jesus' washing of his disciples' feet and his words concerning his desire that they all be one as he and the Father are one, become the foretaste of his total gift of self upon the cross.

From these various interpretations of Jesus self-giving at the last supper the church has shaped the tradition of what we do at Mass. As we take, bless, break and share the Eucharist, we are also called to *be* the Eucharist by serving each other, by "washing each other's feet". We are commissioned at the end of Mass to go forth and reflect the Eucharist in our own lives. Our participation in the celebration of the Eucharist is our fuel for living a Eucharistic life. No wonder Vatican II calls it the "source and summit" of our Christianity.
