## FROM FR. FRAN

As a result of conversations at our last Parish Pastoral Council meeting, the PPC has established a subcommittee to help us gather information about who we are as a parish. During the summer, members of the committee have been formulating a plan that will commence in the fall.

While the plan is not yet finalized, the group has come up with a few areas to focus in on. First and foremost, the group would like to get a picture of who we are. To that end we will be developing a parish directory. It has been many years since a project such as this has been undertaken. Over time the face of our parish has changed. For a number of years we have been using a computer program called ParishSoft to keep track of registrations, births, deaths, family sacramental moments, and faith formation info. With a parish directory we will be able to update all of that information.

The second area of focus will be the development of a questionnaire in which parishioners will be able to express their feelings about parish life, needs, and future pastoral programs.

In doing research for this part of the project, I came upon the results of the last parish questionnaire from twenty or so years ago. It was very interesting to see what the concerns were back then, and what the parish is about today. Looking through the responses brought to mind a similar survey I was a part of in one of my former parishes. In that survey many people said how welcoming the parish was, and at the same time others expressed how cold people were to each other. The music program was highly praised by some and derided by others. In one of my favorite comments, the respondent declared that the piano should be chopped up and used for firewood.

One of the joys and tensions of parish life is that Catholicism truly is "here comes everybody". We bring all our personal experiences of faith and join together as the Body of Christ at Eucharist and in parish life. Even when we are open to learning from each other and respecting each other's experience, parish life is always challenging.

Our forthcoming survey is meant to help us discover if we are addressing current spiritual and social needs and what we can do to better support the part of the Body of Christ that is St. Matthias Parish.

A third area that our subcommittee will focusing in on is spreading the word about our faith community within the wider community. As we prepare to become a Pastoral Collaborative with St. Michael's and Immaculate Conception over the next few years, evangelization, being the centerpiece of the Archdiocesan Disciples in Mission program, will become more and more important. Of course we won't wait until then to spread the word about our faith community!

Each one of us has an important part to play in developing the faith life of our parish. I encourage you to participate in the initiatives I've described above when things get going in the fall. And there's no time like the present to be "ambassadors" for our parish. In fact, it's part of our baptismal calling to invite people to the table of the Eucharist and into parish life.
