PARISHPAY TRANSITION TO WESHARE

If you currently give online through ParishPay, your account will be transferred to WeShare, our new online giving provider, on **Monday, October 9**. The transfer should take just a few days to complete. This transfer ensures that your scheduled transactions will continue to be received by St. Matthias Parish as scheduled.

The security of your personal information is very important to WeShare and to us. If you want to make any changes to your account or adjust your giving amount, WeShare requires a **one-time security verification** to provide you access. To access the WeShare website, click on the on-line giving link on the St. Matthias web site (www.stmattpar.org).

To successfully complete the verification process you will need:

Your ParishPay User Name:

The last four digits of the bank account or credit card that is currently being used for your donations

And ONE of the following two options:

The email you used to register with ParishPay

A collection name and a specific amount donated in the last six months
