FROM FR. FRAN

The Feast of Christ the King

The official title of today's feast is the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. In an age where it's common knowledge that Leonardo DiCaprio declared himself "the king of the world" years ago on the deck of the Titanic, and countless science fiction and comic book characters claim all of creation as their own, a title such as "King of the Universe" can seem either comic or silly. However, when you look back on the origins of this feast, the title reclaims its power and impact.

In 1925, Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in his encyclical *Quas Primas*. The letter was a response to what he saw as the dangers of growing secularism and nationalism, especially in Europe. The feast, which he titled "Our Lord Jesus Christ the King" was a reminder that ultimate authority rests, not within the power of earthly kings, dictators, and presidents, but within the power of God alone. In Jesus Christ, that power is experienced as a foretaste and promise of the fulfillment of the reign or "kingdom" of God.

From its inception until 1969, this feast was celebrated on the last Sunday in October, preceding the Feast of All Saints by a few days. In 1969, Pope Paul VI gave the feast its current name and transferred its celebration to the very last Sunday of the liturgical year. So, we now conclude each year of faith by celebrating Christ as the one who brings all things, seen and unseen, to God, through his death and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Given the present state of the world and politics, perhaps this feast has even more relevance now than it did in 1925. Sadly, here in 2017 we see another rise of nationalism in Europe and the United States. Here at home, Neo-Nazis and white supremacists have once again taken

to the streets with their words of hatred and discrimination. For Catholics, Pope Pius XI words of wisdom ring true for our time. The ultimate power and authority in the world come from God who rules with justice, mercy, compassion and inclusion.
