FROM FR. FRAN

One of the most important reforms in the U.S. Catholic Church coming out of the ongoing abuse crisis is the 2002 "Dallas Charter". I don't think the public at large, or the Catholic faithful for that matter, has an awareness of this important document and how it has, in a dramatic fashion, changed the way in which allegations of abuse are handled by church officials. It also puts forth a mandate for comprehensive plans for the safety of children and young people within parish environments.

The "Dallas Charter" formally known as the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* was originally written by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as a response to the revelations of sexual abuse by priests that came forth in 2002, largely as a result of the Boston Globe Spotlight Team's series of articles chronicling the devastating stories of abuse and cover up that occurred in the Archdiocese of Boston. Over the last decade and a half, the charter has been revised to reflect new findings and the development of better and more comprehensive ways of dealing with the issues. The latest revisions were approved just this June.

As stated in an article on the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' website, the charter is: a comprehensive set of procedures originally established by the USCCB in June 2002 for addressing allegations of sexual abuse of minors by Catholic clergy. The Charter also includes guidelines for reconciliation, healing, accountability, and prevention of future acts of abuse."

The article goes on to bullet point the important issues explored within the Charter's pages, including: creating a safe environment for children and young people; the healing and reconciliation of victims and survivors; making prompt and effective responses to allegations; cooperating with civil authorities; disciplining offenders; providing for means of accountability to ensure the problem continues to be dealt with through the Secretary of Child and Youth Protection and the National Review Board.

October 6 and 7 — Parish Maintenance Collection October 13 and 14 — Holy Father's "Peter's Pence" October 20 and 21 — World Mission Sunday While not perfect by any means, the implementation of the Charter has made a huge difference in the day to day life of parishes and in the safety of children. This was a major step for church leadership which, not so many years before, was often complicit in cover ups and the concealment of the problem of abuse in the church.

Many of the current voices calling for greater protection of children in the church are unaware of this Charter and of how the incidence of abuse and reporting of abuse occurring after 2002 has dropped dramatically. I think it's important for us to be able to enter the conversation well informed as to what the church is doing. I encourage each parishioner to go to the USCCB website and read the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. You can find the document at usccb.org, under the drop-down banner of Issues and Action: Child and Youth Protection. (We will also have a link on our web page.)

Some critics of the Charter have taken issue with the fact that this is an "in house" product, written and released by a body of bishops which included those complicit in cover ups, and those who may have been abusers themselves. While there is truth to that criticism, it can't take away from the fact that the Charter is an important step forward. Children are now safer and abusers are now dealt with appropriately.

I think that the next major step forward is happening right now, namely, determining how to hold bishops accountable for their actions, and this may be the greatest challenge of all. Let's pray that the Holy Spirit will give our leaders the wisdom and courage to tackle the issues head on and the outcome will be a church free from all forms of abuse, cover-ups, and clericalism.
