Sacrament of the Sick

Each fall our parish celebrates the **Sacrament of the Sick** at our weekend masses. This year's celebration will be on **October 26th and 27th.**

From the beginnings of the church, communities have gathered around those who are ill and, with a priest to lead, they have lifted up prayer for the sick, invoked the presence of the Holy Spirit and anointed them with the blessed oil. In this sacramental encounter we believe that God has showered grace and strength on the sick person.

The point of this anointing is not for the person to receive a miraculous recovery, (although if God chooses to do so, it is an incredible gift) rather, it is to unite the sick person, the community and Christ together in asking the Creator to be gracious and close to the sick person.

It is up to each individual to discern if a sharing in this sacrament would be a helpful and comforting experience during a time of illness – physical, emotional or spiritual. Also, those who will be having surgery or testing in the next weeks are invited to the sacrament as well as those feeling the effects of aging. The gift of the sacrament is to strengthen the sick person and to instill God's inner peace and healing. If your physical, emotional or spiritual condition is such that this moment would bring strength and comfort, we invite you to partake of the Sacrament of the Sick.

Sacrament of the Sick is not "the Last Rites"

The ritual at the end of a person's life is still commonly called "last rites" by many Catholics. However, the Church's ritual appropriate to those in their last days on earth is actually called **Viaticum**, meaning "food for the journey". Originating in the ancient tradition of giving one who is setting out on a journey a banquet as well as those things needed for their travels, the rite of Viaticum includes a forgiveness of sins, a litany of mercy, an invocation of the saints, and the reception of communion as food for the journey home to God. While Viaticum is not synonymous with the Sacrament of the Sick, it may also include the laying on of hands and anointing with oil.

Unfortunately, for a number of Catholics, the Sacrament of the Sick is still synonymous with "last rites". Not a week goes by that a priest doesn't get a call from a hospital, hospice, or parishioner requesting "the last rites" for a loved one who is near death. What is usually desired and expected is the anointing of the Sacrament of the Sick. However, Viaticum, as explained above, is the church's rite for the dying.

Another common situation is that in which a Catholic, for whom the Sacrament of the Sick would be most appropriate, does *not* want to receive it because they equate it with imminent death. I have frequently heard well-meaning family members say: "Please father, just say some prayers, if you anoint her she'll think she's dying".

Still another misconception is that Viaticum or "last rites" is only to be administered just before death. Frequently a care giver will seek a priest only in those final hours. Often in such a situation a priest will not be available, causing anxiety for the family and the dying person. Viaticum may be celebrated with a terminally ill person *at any time* during the final phase of their illness. Since it is especially meaningful if the person is conscious and able to participate, the sooner in the final illness the better.

I hope this helps distinguish between the Sacrament of the Sick and Viaticum or "last who never fails to embrace all who come in search of healing, peace and eternal life.
