- Registrants will receive a confirmation email.
- Walk-ins will be directed to a meeting spot and will be seated once all cars have arrived.

A COVID Christmas

With the pandemic reaching new highs, the medical experts tell us that the safest way to celebrate the holidays is within our own "bubble" or cohort of people with whom we live or come into contact with on a daily basis. As difficult as this was for Thanksgiving, I know it will be even more frustrating for many of us at this time of year, when we look forward to gatherings of family and friends.

Not to be a Grinch about the whole thing, but as Catholic Christians it is a moral imperative to look out for each other and not put each other in harm's way. We have all heard the stories of small family gatherings or large weddings that have turned into super spreader events. Far from being a political thing, wearing a mask, keeping your distance, and washing your hands frequently is about following Christ command to love one another as we love ourselves.

This doesn't make the choices we will be making surrounding the Christmas holidays any easier. However, the sacrifices we make this Christmas will allow us to spend many future Christmases together.
