(Please be aware: The windows and doors to the church are kept open during the service to help with air circulation, so please dress appropriately.

- Click **Details** (If you would like to Follow our group to see future events, you may click the **Follow** button, otherwise this can be ignored).d
- ♦ Click Register.
- One household member may sign-up for the reservation of a pew for his/her household. You are registering for a single pew not multiple seats, but seating is general admission (you will be shown to your pew).
- Each household will be seated on one side of the pew for safe distancing up to 3/4 people. We are able to seat households larger than 3/4 when alternating with a single parishioner in a pew. We are also limiting the number of people attending to 50-80.
- For each registration, you must answer COVID questions for ALL attendees in your pew (ie. the answers must apply to all as you will only be asked one time).
   Questions will be used for screening only and will be kept confidential.
- Enter the number of household members attending mass as well as list his/her full name(s) and alternate contact information if necessary.
- Registrant will receive a confirmation email with additional instructions.

#### **Guidelines:**

- 1.) If you are sick, please do not register for a reservation to attend.
- 2.) Please arrive by 9:45 AM to allow time for parking and check-in. Parking will be in every other space to provide for safe distancing. Check-in will be in the front of the church building at the side entrance and will be marked for safe distancing.
- 3.) All attendees must be listed on the registration to enter.
- 4.) Please check our website, Facebook or call our parish office for updates, cancellations, etc.
- 5.) Please bring and wear your own mask unless there are health issues that prevent you from wearing a mask. Children under 2 are not required to wear a mask.
- 6.) Bring and use your own personal hand sanitizer.
- 7.) Observe physical distancing.
- 8.) Follow the directions of all ushers, volunteers, and staff.
- 9.) You will be asked several questions at the time of registration and at the entry point regarding your exposure to COVID. If Marlborough is in a red zone, temperatures will be taken prior to entrance.

#### 'Tis Still the Season!

The Christmas Season is still in high gear with today's Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. While the world around us may be packing up the Christmas paraphernalia and dreaming of a COVID free Christmas for next year, the church calendar tells us that today we are at the mid-point of the Christmas season as we celebrate the visit of the mysterious Magi from the East.

Epiphany commemorates not just the visit of these wise ones, but, in a theological sense, it celebrates the outsider *recognizing* and *being recognized by* the Christ child, born, not for a small circle of family and friends, but for all peoples of all times.

The word "epiphany" can mean manifestation, revelation, or illumination. When the early Christians celebrated the Epiphany, they were celebrating all of the following in one feast: the Nativity, when Jesus was revealed to the small band of shepherds in Bethlehem; the Epiphany when, through the visit of the Magi from the east, Jesus was revealed to people outside of the small Jewish nation; his baptism, when God revealed Jesus as "beloved Son"; and the wedding feast at Cana, when Jesus revealed the miraculous power of God working through him. Eventually, in the Western Church, these Epiphany themes evolved into what we know today as the Christmas Season.

For Catholic Christians, our mission is to keep alive the message that God has become one of us, and continues to call all people of the earth to live as *one* family.

This takes hard work, especially after experiencing a year when the human family seemed to be coming apart at the seams. It also takes some deep selfreflection. Not the kind where we bemoan our mistakes and wallow in regrets, but self-reflection that invites us to take an honest, critical, yet loving look at ourselves, always from within the embrace of our compassionate and forgiving God.

Here are a few challenging questions to jump start our reflection. Hopefully they will lead us into bold action on behalf of Christ.

As Jesus welcomed and ministered to all sorts of people while he was on earth, how well do I welcome and reach out to others, especially those whom I define as "different" or "difficult"? As Jesus had no problem calling out actions that subjugated the poor and the weak, do I make it a point to advocate on behalf of those on the margins of society? As Jesus was, and is, the bearer of God's mercy and forgiveness, am I being merciful and forgiving to others through my words and actions? As Jesus called us not be fear but trust in God, have I trusted in God's guiding hand through life's difficulties? As the Magi brought gifts to Jesus which they valued greatly, what gifts will I bring to the Lord as he is present in stranger, foe, and friend?

As we put an exhausting and exasperating year behind us, let us begin a new journey of discipleship in 2021, resolving to be light, hope, and peace for one another. In the spirit of the Epiphany, may we illumine the world with the light of Christ.


