Triduum Reflection by River Maria Kaplun, Parishioner

Last Sunday, having journeyed with the Christ through Lent toward his death and resurrection, we celebrated Easter, the exultation of which will continue for the Easter season. The Easter Triduum is the culmination of our entire liturgical year. It begins with the solemnity of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, plunges us into a reflection on sorrow and sacrifice on Good Friday, and reaches its high point on Saturday night with the "mother of all vigils."

I was baptized as an adult on Easter Vigil twelve years ago, and so this Mass lives in a special corner of my heart. I love its beauty, its mystery, and the metamorphosis of darkness into blinding and irrepressible joy. It is on this night—as we move into the dark church holding the candles lit from the Paschal flame, as we hear the readings and the music that take us from emptiness of time before the world to God's tender promise to become water for our thirst, as the lights come on in the sanctuary and the bells ring triumphantly while we sing glory to our risen Lord—it is on this miraculous night that we can almost experience the wonder of Jesus's resurrection.

Twelve years ago on Easter Vigil I was handed my first communion, and it took me several minutes before I was able to put it to my lips. It felt too holy, too sacred, too long -awaited to finally be one with it, and when eventually I did take it, I broke down in sobs. I still cry sometimes after the Eucharist because it's just so hard to believe.

Twelve years ago on Easter Vigil I and one other stood clad in white before the baptismal font in a small Pennsylvania church. Before our congregation, who'd seen us through a long year of RCIA, we were asked if we renounced sin and if we believed, and together we answered, "We do." Everybody laughed because we were supposed to answer each for ourselves, "I do," but I think our instinct, the reflexive move of the heart from newcomers to the faith, was not wrong. We come to this faith together, and together we are the Church of Christ. We sing as one voice and act as his hands, and only together can we experience the mystery of life that triumphs over death.

As our Confirmation candidates approach their reception of the sacrament of Confirmation please join with them and their families in prayer that they will be open to the gifts of the Holy

Spirit of wisdom and understanding, enlighten our minds to perceive the mysteries of the universe in relation to eternity.

Spirit of right judgement and courage, guide and make us firm in our baptismal decision to follow Jesus' way of love.

Spirit of knowledge and reverence, help us to see the lasting value of justice and mercy in everyday dealings with one another. May we respect life as we work to solve the problems of family, economy and ecology.

Spirit of God, spark our faith, hope and love into new action each day. Fill our lives with wonder and awe in your presence which permeates all creation. **Amen** - Catholic online


A Note from Peter Brockmann, Director of Music

This past March 31, 2022 was the 337th birthday of Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750), one of my favorite composers. You may recognize some of his most popular works as Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring (BWV 147), the Brandenburg Concertos or perhaps a Prelude and Fugue from Das Weltempiered Klavier (BWV 846-869) that I play on occasion as the recessional during the Lenten season. He wrote over 1,000 works, catalogued in the Bach-Werke-Verzichnis (BWV), or Bach Work Catalog.

Some interesting bits about Bach:

- one of his works in the catalog, the 'Canon triplex a 6' (BWV 1046) was actually a piece of music in his hand in a portrait painted in 1748.
- the B minor Mass (BWV 232) which is a big orchestral work with two choirs and several soloists takes two hours to perform, was never performed during his lifetime. Despite that, it is today considered one of the supreme achievements of classical music.
- Bach wrote over 200 Contatas as part of his job as director of church music in Leipzig Germany. Cantatas are musical works with four soloists, a choir, organ and orchestra. The texts were from 18th century poetry, Lutheran hymns of the day and were related to the sacred readings prescribed by the Lutheran liturgy at the St Thomas Church in Leipzig Germany, were sung in German. For a three year period, he introduced a new Cantata at Sunday worship, every week. This took enormous creative energies, but also a gifted orchestra, choir and readily accessible soloists.
- After his death in 1750, his music fell somewhat into obscurity until about 1830 when Felix Mendelssohn (age 20) staged a revival of public performances of Bach's St Matthew Passion, after his grandmother gave him a copy of the manuscript for his birthday five years before. Mendelssohn is credited with igniting worldwide attention on Bach's music.
- the catalog BWV was first published in 1950.
- Six hymns including O SACRED HEAD SURROUNDED #435, SONG OF THANKFULNESS AND PRAISE #383, AT THE LAMB'S HIGH FEAST WE SING #463, A MIGHTY FORTRESS IS OUR GOD #594 in GATHER II were harmonized by JS Bach.

Let us sing.




