

FROM FR. FRAN

Easter Thanks!

Our parish experienced many wonderful liturgical celebrations from Palm Sunday through the Easter Triduum. A heartfelt thank you to the many parishioners who gave of their time and talent to make our celebrations so prayerful, and joy filled. Special thanks to our Holy Week/Triduum Team who prepared all our liturgies, the members of our music ministry who led us so beautifully in sung prayer, those who decorated our church environment gloriously, both inside and outside, and those who served so well in the various liturgical ministries. You will see a listing of those parishioners, in this week's bulletin insert, who volunteered to make ensure our parish had a most joyous Holy Week and Easter.

Easter, of course, is a full season. It runs for 50 days, from the celebration of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday to the celebration of Christ's gift of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday. During these Easter weeks we will celebrate Infant Baptisms, First Eucharist, and Confirmation with many of the young people and young families in our parish. Please keep them in your prayers as they make the final preparations for receiving these Sacraments of Initiation.

Speaking of Initiation, we were fortunate to celebrate the Rites of Initiation at the Easter Vigil with our newest Catholic Christian, Truman Sarazen. It was a wonderful night for Truman and his family. The pitcher I used to baptize Truman is an heirloom in his family. His mother and a cousin were baptized with the very same pitcher. It was an honor to share in this bit of family history as Truman was welcomed into the Catholic family.

The Fifty Day Season of Easter

The word Easter comes from an ancient root that can be translated as "to shine", "dawn" or "the direction of the sunrise". As far back as the third century there is evidence that Easter was celebrated for a period of 50 days. (Easter is actually *older* than its preparatory season of Lent which lasts 40 days.) The first week of Easter is called the "octave" of Easter. It has been described as "a week of Easter Sundays", or an Easter Sunday that lasts for a week. The rest of the weeks of Easter will lead up to the season's grand finale, the great feast of Pentecost.

Easter is the Church's ultimate season of joy; so much so that there were periods in the church when the people would remain standing to pray and were prohibited from kneeling and fasting for the entire 50 days.

Here at St. Matthias, to highlight the seasonal nature of Easter, for the next eight weeks we will be singing songs that reflect the resurrection and Christ's appearances to the disciples. This will also be reflected in the scripture readings for the first few weeks of the season. The weekly replenishment of our Easter flowers will also remind us of the 50 days of the festival. During the latter part of the season, the scriptures, our music, and our environment will remind us of the approaching feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, commissioning them to go out into the world to tell the good news of the Gospel.

Financial Notes

Collection for Clergy Trust Fund: Each year the Archdiocese of Boston designates the Easter Sunday Collection in support of the care and health of our active and retired priests who have served our parishes faithfully over the years. It's not too late to give to this important collection. As priests are aging and living longer there are increased needs as well as increased prices for medications and procedures. It is the Clergy Trust that takes care of all of this, and they are in need of your generosity. You can give online if you use WeShare or give through cash or a check written out to St. Matthias and earmarked for the Clergy Trust. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.

Special Easter Season Parish Donation: Since our parish loses its normal Sunday collection on Easter, I'd like to invite parishioners to consider a special donation during the Easter Season, if you are able. You can do this online at WeShare, or by bringing an envelope with your donation to Mass from *April 16th (the Second Sunday of Easter) through May 28th (Pentecost Sunday)* and mark it "Special Easter Season Donation". Thanks!

A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

You might recall that during Lent there are many things we refrain from doing during our liturgies:

- 1. no Gloria. sigh.
- 2. no Alleluia. double sigh.
- 3. no recessional hymn.


Thankfully it was during the Easter Vigil that we broke the fast on these three musical elements of our worship. During the Easter season which will last until Pentecost Sunday, May 28, we will do our best to restore these three elements, and in the spirit of Resurrection Joy, we'll add two more:

- 4. the Sprinkling Rite and,
- 5. The Easter Alleluia! for dismissal.

The Sprinkling Rite in the Mass is an opportunity for us to recall our own baptism and renew our commitment to faith more directly than through words and music, but through the action where the celebrant passes through the sanctuary distributing blessed water onto the faithful. Our physical response is to give the sign of the Cross, and sing the Sprinkling Song from the "Mass of St Matthias".

The Easter Alleluia! is the final dismissal for our weekend liturgies during this season, as confidently and excellently intoned by our deacons - Russ, Doug and Paul. It's meant to be a declaration that ends with an!

So, our response is to sing "Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia!" in the same key, joyful, confidence and exuberant style as intoned by the deacon.




