

Pastoral Collaborative News

As of this writing, Tuesday April 25th, there is no news on our Pastoral Collaborative. I spoke with Sean Hickey, the Assistant Director of Clergy Personnel this week. He informed me that the process of naming pastors is going slower than expected due to the sheer number of parishes and priests involved. About half of the Pastoral Collaboratives have been filled at this point. Some of them may start on June 1st but a number of the remaining ones may be moved to a July 1st start. He thought I should be hearing in a week or two about my assignment. And so we wait!

A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

This week, our Easter season themes of New Life, Resurrection and Alleluia! Joy are enhanced with the vivid sheep and shepherd imagery of the ever-popular Psalm 23, "The Lord is my Shepherd."

Musically, we bring together a famous setting by the French Jesuit priest Fr Joseph Gelineau SJ (1920-2008) with the Preparation song by Fr Fran - Shepherd of my Heart as temporal bookends to resonate with our Gospel reading from John, where Jesus himself offers a twist on the well-known theme of God's care for his people.

Psalm 23 was originally written by King David, who as you know was a shepherd before he became a king. In this psalm, he used his experience of caring for sheep to describe God's love and care for his people, offering us all forgiveness of sins, rest for the weary and redemption. The psalmist acknowledges that God is the source of everything one needs. God is the psalmists' personal Lord and Shepherd, not just a distant or generic deity. The psalm invites us to also trust in God as our Shepherd, who knows us by name and cares for our every need.

Throughout history, Psalm 23 has been a source of comfort and hope for many people, especially in times of trouble and grief, when people most need a reminder that they are loved. The shepherd and sheep analogy is used to depict God's gentleness and guidance throughout our lives, and the love of a particular Shepherd - Jesus - who is willing to lay down His life for his sheep. Indeed, we are blessed to call him Lord.

Let us sing!


