

From Fr. Fran

June is the traditional month in the Archdiocese of Boston for priest transfers. This year those accepting new assignments as pastors are many more in number than usual due to the great number of Pastoral Collaboratives that will be initiated in June and July. (As you know, our transition to a Collaborative with St. Michael Parish has been postponed to a date to be determined.)

A change of pastor always produces a level of anxiety within parishes and within pastors. Parishioners may ask will the new pastor respect the life and traditions of the parish or will he want to change things significantly. A new pastor may wonder how his gifts and talents will be accepted among the people. Are the parishioners sad that their pastor is leaving or are they grateful that he is going?

For those parishes initiating Collaboratives this month and next there are *many* questions and grey areas concerning how parish life will be impacted. We have touched upon a number of them in our Preparing for the Pastoral Collaborative Series written by members of our Parish Pastoral Council. This series is well worth your reflection. The articles are found on our parish website.

We know now that when we do become a Collaborative with St. Michael Parish there will be a new pastor and I will receive a new assignment from the cardinal. I understand how some parishioners are sad that I will be moving on and others sad that they're stuck with me for the time being. As much as I am grateful for spending over half of my priesthood here at St. Matthias, I look forward to what lies ahead. In this day and age, it's not the norm for a pastor to be in a parish as long as I have been here. I consider my time here as a great privilege.

This week marks the 38th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood. Much has happened during those years. The church has weathered many storms. What is constant is the presence of the Holy Spirit guiding us through the rough waters and revealing the joy and responsibility of being disciples of Christ.

This weekend as we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate our participation in Christ, not only when we receive him at the altar, but as we take him into our everyday lives. The pastor of a parish is called to help each parishioner do just that. A pastor doesn't bring Christ to the people, a pastor helps people discover how Christ is already working in their lives. If, when a pastor leaves a parish, parishioners remember him as one who helped them recognize Christ in one another and to live out their baptismal call to love as Christ loves, then he's done his job well.

Please keep in your prayers the many parishes and priests experiencing changes over the next few months as all settle into their new assignments. May the Holy Spirit pour forth upon our archdiocese a strong sense of unity and mission to all who follow Christ and proclaim his Good News.

Financial Notes

As announced last weekend, we have met and exceeded the \$75 thousand dollar goal for our Grand Annual Collection! To date we have collected \$76,175. Thanks so much to all who have contributed and those who put us over the top. If you have yet to donate to this important fund raiser, there is still time. Our books won't close on the Grand Annual until June 30th.

While this is a great achievement, news on our weekly finances is sobering. Our Finance Commission is estimating that we will end the year with a \$10-15 thousand dollar deficit. This is primarily due to our not hitting the weekly offertory goal and significant unbudgeted necessary repairs to the heating system.

As the Finance Council is doing its part to create a balanced budget, may I invite you to do your part in helping our parish with its financial commitments. If you are able, an increase in weekly donations would help us greatly. If we can consistently achieve our \$4 thousand dollar per week goal, we can end the fiscal year 2024 with a small surplus. Just by increasing your offertory gift by a few dollars per week, I'm confident we can meet that goal.

Please consider online giving as a way to secure a consistent offertory, especially during the summer months. Setting up a WeShare account only takes a few minutes and will help us greatly.

A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

This weekend is a great celebration of the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, more simply known by its Latin moniker - Corpus Christi.

The Norbertine canoness (a religious sister), Juliana of Liège was inspired in a dream to promote the feast throughout the the first half of the 13th Century. Juliana convinced her local bishop in Belgium to declare the Thursday after Trinity Sunday the first celebration of Corpus Christi in 1246.

Saint Thomas Aquinas (we sang his song Pange Lingua at the Altar of Repose downstairs on Holy Thursday) proposed the feast to Pope Urban IV to emphasize the joy of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Pope Urban IV, who had served in the church in Liège, was familiar with the celebration in Liège and agreed with Aquinas' proposal and established the feast as a "Solemnity" in 1264, extending it to the whole Roman Catholic Church, the first Church-wide feast establishment of its kind.

Today also marks the beginning of our choir's summer hiatus. It has been a wonderfully fruitful season - September - June, with several new members, many musical innovations, instrumentalists and original unpublished works by Father Fran. As a Holy Laboratory of praise and worship, St Matthias parish music ministry is a blessing to be part of, and a joy to serve. Thank you to our composer, worship booklet makers, cantors, our singers, our flautists and our substitutes. As director, I hope that more of you all reading this article will join me in singling out the prayerful contributions of our ministry. I also hope that you'll consider and pray for guidance to join our cheerful band and get to know each other and Jesus better each day. We're always accepting new members. 


