

### From Fr. Fran

#### **Archdiocesan Assignments**

As I mentioned a few weeks ago, June is the usual time in the Archdiocese of Boston when new assignments for priests and pastors are announced. This year I stopped counting at over 60 transfers, reappointments, and retirements. With so many merged parishes, new parishes, and Pastoral Collaboratives receiving new leaders, this is a time of great change in the archdiocese. Guided by the Holy Spirit, this provides a great opportunity for renewal and recommitment to the way of Christian discipleship in our portion of God's vineyard.

While most of the Pastoral Collaborative initiatives began in 2012 have been completed, there are still a few Collaboratives, such as ours with St. Michael, that have yet to begin. As I have mentioned previously, we do not have a date for our Collaborative to commence. My guess is that, at the earliest, it would be around this time next year. But this is only a guess. I have no inside information. When the move does finally come, I will be assigned to another parish in the archdiocese.

Since I announced this a few weeks ago, many parishioners have been asking when I'm leaving and where I'm going. (Here's your hat, what's your hurry?). Again, let me reiterate, it looks like you're stuck with me for a while to come. (Then again, as things go in the archdiocese, I may be asked to take a parish tomorrow. That's the way of the parish priest.)

I've lost count on how many delays we've seen in the start of our Collaborative. This doesn't mean we have been forgotten by the archdiocese, although it can feel that way. While it may seem we're kicking the can down the road yet again, we have a great opportunity to ready ourselves even further for when we do become a Pastoral Collaborative.

Once the new administrator of St. Michael Parish, Fr, Jason Giombetti, gets settled we will resume working with parishioners at St. Michael's moving towards the day when we will be sharing personnel and resources.

Please keep the Archdiocese of Boston, its priests, and parishioners in your prayers over the next few weeks as the many transitions take place.

#### **Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist Needed**

The archdiocese has given the go ahead for the return of the cup at all masses. I would like to invite all those who were Eucharistic Ministers before the pandemic to pray about returning to this important ministry in our parish. We will need at least two ministers of the cup initially for both masses. We will have a training/retraining session to get everyone back up to speed.

If you have volunteered to be a new Eucharistic Minister over the past few months or would like to return to this ministry, *please send me an e mail within the next few days*.

#### **Parish Finances**

Congratulations to our parishioners who have helped achieve our \$75,000 goal for our Grand Annual Collection. We are now at \$77,295 which is 103.1% of our goal.

This is the last week for you to contribute if you have yet to do so. Our books close this Friday, June 30<sup>th</sup>. Since we will most likely end the year with a \$10 -15-thousand-dollar deficit (due to Offertory shortfall) a contribution to the Grand Annual at this time will help us greatly.

During the summer months, while parishioners are away enjoying well deserved vacations, our parish is still up and running and in need of your continued contributions. The best way to guarantee a steady income for St. Matthias is to sign up for our on-line giving program, WeShare. It's quick and easy. Once you determine the amount for your weekly or monthly donation it will be automatically and safely transferred to our parish. You won't have to worry about writing a check each week and the parish won't have to worry about a steady income. A win/win.

I know that some folks are apprehensive about online transfers but give a call to our parish office and April Lowe will happily walk you through the process and address any questions or concerns.

Regardless of how you chose to contribute, thank you so much for your generosity to our parish.

#### A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

Our preparation song this weekend is #596 in Gather 2 - "Be Not Afraid" by Bob Dufford, SJ.

This well known hymn was written when Bob was a seminarian. He saw it as a prayer for strength as he transitioned from being a layperson to being a transitional deacon and then to being a priest in the early 1970s. Many people find it comforting as they face the perils of their own daily lives. For me, I've noticed that it has become a source of great comfort to mourners at Catholic funerals.

I like to remind families when collaborating on the funeral music for their loved one, that the refrain paraphrases the words of Jesus when he appeared to the apostles after his death and Resurrection. You can imagine the grief and fear they must have felt. Every creak of the step or knock at the door made them think the Romans were coming to get them. Saint John Paul II used these words too, as he returned to Poland for the first time as Pope, which gave the Polish people the moral courage to hasten the fall of Communism in the early 1980s. And, we shouldn't be afraid because Jesus has done this death thing already. He's gone before us and shows the way to a future eternity with our heavenly Father. We. Can. Do. This. Together.

Among musicians there is much 'debate' about the best way to start the first and second verses. It's a pickup of two sixteenth notes, which are most often morphed into twice-as -long two eighth notes. I say that you shouldn't worry, just sing it like you mean it and it'll all work out fine, since it is the refrain that matters the most in this hymn.






