

From Fr. Fran

As another Independence Day approaches, our thoughts naturally turn toward the freedoms we enjoy as citizens of the United States. However, as Catholic Christians, there is an even greater freedom which we celebrate. We see our true and ultimate freedom in Christ.

First and foremost, we are citizens of God's kingdom. This has important consequences for the way in which we live out our civic lives. The law of the land, for Christians, is Christ's law of love. Loving God, neighbor and self is the context from which we live out our US citizenship.

As we value and celebrate our country's freedoms, we must also acknowledge that such *human* freedom is very fragile. The only freedom that is strong and secure is the freedom that comes from God. This goes beyond all the ideologies and allegiances that we may be bound to here on earth. God is moving us towards that great society where we will sit together as one people, around one banquet table in heaven. God is building that society now, and as baptized members of the Church, we are called to be builders as well. First, we need to decide if we want to join in!

There is much discord in our country these days. It's now taken for granted that national politics has become an "us against them" proposition. Gun violence continues to rise. Psychological and physical effects of the pandemic continue to plague us even as COVID is, for the most part, in our rear-view mirror. Our country was built on the hopes, dreams, and hard work of immigrants, yet a great number of US politicians and citizens turn their backs on the newest wave of immigrants seeking an escape from violence and poverty in their homelands. How are Catholic Christians called to be citizens of this diverse and complicated country and disciples of Christ at the same time?

I think that the living out of our Christianity can impact everyday life in many ways. We can bring something radical to the table by the way in which we treat each other, in our willingness to forgive, by our acceptance of one another's uniqueness.

Catholic Christians are not about an "eye for an eye", we are not about always being "number one", we are not about acquiring more wealth than our neighbor. No, in Christ we are about always looking after the weak, the poor, and the marginalized. We are about sharing our resources for the benefit of others. We are about building a society where humility and forgiveness aren't bad things.

The challenge for us as Catholic Christians and US citizens is to bring the things of God into the marketplace. We do this not by shouting out agendas or shouting down others, not by accusatory language or condescending speeches, but by one thing and one thing only: by witnessing to Christ's law of love every day and in every corner of our land.

Some years ago, liturgical composer Fr. Michael Joncas wrote a hymn text reflecting what our home country could be if we lived by this command of love. Below is the last stanza. Perhaps we could take it to reflection along with our Independence Day festivities.

A Place Called Home – stanza four

A place called home for ev'ry human being: A place called home, where arms are opened wide; A place called home, where all extend the welcome; Where none are lost, alone, or cast aside But members of a single human fam'ly. God grant us grace to build a place called home.



A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR PETER BROCKMAN

TAKE UP YOUR CROSS, #690 in Gather 2, is based on the poem of the same name by the Episcopal minister, Charles Everest. The Reverend Charles was born in East Windsor CT in 1814 and died in Waterbury CT in 1877. He published a book of poems entitled "Vision of Death and Other Poems" in 1845. In 1861 it appeared in Britain, as one of two American poems without musical setting in the first edition of the Hymns Ancient and Modern hymnal.

The music, O WALY, WALY is an English folk tune dating from the 1600s where it was more commonly known as "The Water is Wide."




