

## From Fr. Fran

Thank you for your hospitality and generosity to Fr. J.B. Ndung'u, who was with us last weekend from Kenya. Fr. J.B. commented that he visits many different parishes for mission appeals, and he can tell right away what the character of a parish is. He found St. Matthias to be a very welcoming and caring community.

Fr. J.B. told me much about his work with seminarians in his home diocese where he teaches pastoral theology at Christ the King Major Seminary. He works primarily with the new students coming to seminary for the first time. Many of them are from small villages and his job is to get them ready for the rigors of academic and especially pastoral life. This year there will be over 360 men studying for the priesthood at his seminary. Even with that staggering number he said that there won't be enough priests to fulfill the needs of all the parishes.

This is such a different situation from where we find ourselves in the United States. In some respects, we have become "mission territory" due to the present shortage of priests. Many parishes in the U.S. are now staffed by priests from Africa and South America. While grateful for their ministry, there are great challenges for them and for the parishioners where they are assigned. Differences in languages and customs need to be negotiated so that parishioners and priests find themselves in healthy relationships. This takes time and a willingness to learn and change on the part of all involved.

Whenever we host or have a priest from another part of the world assigned to a parish, it gives us the opportunity to recognize that we are truly a "catholic', meaning universal, church. Our faith gathers people together from all over the world to unite at the table of the Eucharist as one family. Often, we see the Catholic Church only through the eyes of our home parish and our own diocese. We can become very insular and "parochial" in the worst sense of the word. I think that is why it's been so hard for so many in the Archdiocese of Boston to embrace the Pastoral Collaboratives and mergers of parishes. This represents a new way of life as a church community. Change is hard. There's no getting around it.

When our beloved home parishes become a part of a Collaborative, we might initially feel more loss than gain. Gradually a new sense of community will form, if the parishioners and staff members are open to it. And that is the key. Do we allow the Holy Spirit to help us through our feelings of loss, our uneasiness with change, and our fear of losing parish identity? Do we trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us into new ways of being church and lead us to new friendships and ministerial relationships? Or do we cultivate an unhealthy nostalgia for "the way it was"?

We are grappling with all this as we prepare to become a Pastoral Collaborative with St. Michael Parish. We've had so many starts and stops that it's been hard to keep a focus on the future. As you know, we were *sure* that our Collaborative would start on July 1<sup>st</sup> of this year. Then we found out that the diocese had delayed it once again. Perhaps this is all the work of the Holy Spirit teaching us patience and giving us some extra time to prepare for the day when the new collaborative adventure begins.

As you know, I will not be with you for the next part of the adventure. There will be a new pastor assigned to the Collaborative. We do not have a timetable for when our Collaborative will begin. So, until that time, we journey together. I hope that in the next few months, working with Fr. Jason Giombetti, the new administrator of St. Michael Parish, we will be able to move forward and prepare well for our Pastoral Collaborative.



### A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR PETER BROCKMANN

Our recessional hymn this weekend is the same as last weekend "BRING FORTH THE KINGDOM", 640 in Gather 2 by Marty Haugen. It's ok to sing the same song, because the gospel is also about building the kingdom. Besides, it's the summer time and with the same Gathering song as last weekend, it feels familiar (but not boring).

The structure of Bring Forth the Kingdom is unusual, especially for a recessional hymn (among the reasons I like this song): cantor - RESPONSE - cantor - RESPONSE refrain (all).

You may have noticed last week that I played the cantor part quietly and really bumped up the volume on the intermittent RESPONSE part. Great fun. Last weekend Jeanine did a great job of showing you when you need to provide the RESPONSE too by raising her hands up at the response and refrain.

Hopefully, this combination of audio signal and visual indication will help you sing this song as it was meant to be sung. Kind of a single voice being the seed, and then the assembly responds, another seed and fuller response and everyone enjoying the refrain.

Let's do the same this weekend - Lisa will expertly provide the physical signal (hand gestures) on your (the assembly's) part, and I will provide the appropriately full sound on the piano when you're to sing along.


