

From Fr. Fran

Financial Report to Parishioners

Please take a moment to read through the annual financial report for FY 2023 which is included with today's bulletin. Prepared by members of our Finance Council, this report gives you a sense of the challenges we faced during the last fiscal year as we continued to recover from the pandemic.

As with many parishes, our numbers have not returned to pre-pandemic levels. With this in mind, I'd like to thank all who have contributed so generously to our parish over the last year. While we ended the fiscal year with a deficit, largely due to the unbudgeted expense surrounding major boiler repairs, we had a relatively good year.

During FY 2023 the Archdiocese of Boston contracted a new accounting firm and new software was introduced for the chart of accounts. A number of categories were changed from the old system resulting in some line items looking as though they came in way over budget when they were simply reclassified. For example, you will see that our pastoral/liturgical expenses were charted as \$7,755.00 over budget. While this category is important to our parish life, we didn't overspend as indicated, as this deficit is offset in Category "Other".

You will see that we exceeded our Grand Annual Goal last year, our monthly maintenance collections were up, and, for the first time in a number of years, we made our assessment for the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. All great achievements. Thank you to all who contributed!

The report also lists a number of repairs that will need to be done in the near future. One of the immediate repairs is to our heating system. Yes, it's the gift that keeps on giving. You may recall that we ended the heating season with some unresolved trouble in the system, namely, the boiler keeps shutting down. The trigger for this has yet to be found. We are presently getting estimates for repairs and will hopefully get things in order before the autumn winds chill us to the bone. So, apologies if it may be a bit nippy in the building during the next few weeks.

Looking toward FY 2024, if we achieve our weekly goal this year of \$4k we will end the year in the black. *That's where you come in*. Our Finance Council has done a great job putting together another bare bones budget. It's only through your weekly generosity that we will be able to achieve financial stability for FY 2024. If it's possible, an increase of just a few dollars by every contributing parishioner will help us achieve our goal. Thanks in advance for your dedication to our parish.

A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR PETER BROCKMANN

Apologies if you missed my article last week, I just missed the deadline.

While I'm apologizing, let me also make a correction on the article of the previous week. I wrote about how the music accompanying Fr Faber's excellent lyric was WELLESLEY by Lizzie Tourjée. Not entirely accurate. The music we sang and played was actually IN BABILONE, which comes to us from the 18th Century (140 years or so before the lyric was written), The Netherlands.

This week, let's spotlight the Communion song - Many and Great - by Paulist Father, Rev Ricky Manalo. First published in 1995, Many and Great is quite refreshing to our 'western' ears. It uses a five-note pentatonic scale that is strongly rooted in South East Asian music traditions. Some consider that it is the first Asian American Catholic liturgical song to have gained popularity in the US Catholic church. It is included in Gather 3 (2011) and Gather 4 (2021). We've been singing it in generally in the fall, since the lyrics remind us of the lifecycle of our lives and our unity with the Holy Communion which follows the same life cycle. *Let Us Sing!*


