

Mass of Remembrance

As we are all one in the body of Christ, we walk with you to share in the grief that you are experiencing as you adjust to life without a loved one by your side. You are in the prayers of the parish, especially in this month of November, when the church reflects upon the fragility of life here on earth and looks forward to the time that we will all be together again, at the banquet table in heaven. Let this Eucharistic Table remind us that our ultimate calling and true home is in heaven.

After Mass we will continue our celebration of life with a reception in the church hall, catered by The Buffet Way and sponsored by Regina and Alan Slattery. Thank you to the Slatterys for their generosity, and to April Lowe for designing the pictorial memorial at the entrance to the church.

I would especially like to thank Deacon Doug Peltak for his amazing care for all who plan funerals in our parish. Doug meets with each family, walks them through the funeral process, and keeps up with the families through a series of letters on the grieving process throughout the first year of the loss of a loved one. His work is truly inspirational and a great gift to our parish family.

Welcome Fr. Jack Carmichael

Cardinal Sean O'Malley has assigned Fr. Jack Carmichael to our parish as Parochial Vicar. He has just finished up as administrator of St. Peter Parish in Cambridge and before that he was pastor of St. Ann By The Sea in Marshfield for many years.

We are in the process of getting rooms ready for him and he will be taking a vacation, so we won't be seeing Fr. Carmichael until around December 1st.

Over the next few months, I will be getting ready to accept a new assignment in the archdiocese come the spring. At that time, Fr. Carmichael will most likely be assigned here as administrator or pastor. We no longer anticipate becoming a Pastoral Collaborative with St. Michael in Hudson for the foreseeable future.

It's been a very long time since St. Matthias parish last had a parochial vicar assigned here. In the "olden days" a parochial vicar was called a "curate". While both titles may sound somewhat foreign, they both mean that the priest is an associate to the pastor, sharing the same sacramental and pastoral ministry as the pastor without the ultimate responsibility (and headaches) that go along with the job. In other words, the buck stops with the pastor, not the parochial vicar. (Most lucky is the parochial vicar!)

St. Matthias 2024 Grand Annual Campaign **Thermometer Has Returned Have You Made Your Donation Yet?**

While the outdoor thermometer is steadily going down, our Grand Annual Thermometer is ready to turn on the heat! Please consider being one of the parishioners who

Most weeks, our weekly Offertory misses that goal significantly. If you are financially able to do so, an increase of just a few dollars per week will help us to keep on track with our 2024 budget.

Offertory Procession, and the **Eucharistic Cup Have Returned.**

Last weekend, we reinstituted the cup at both weekend masses. The Eucharistic Ministers did a splendid job in resuming their ministry. The priest and deacons, however, well that was a different story! Please give us old guys some time to get back into the rhythm of the liturgy with Eucharistic Ministers.

We are still in need of more parishioners to come forward and participate in this important ministry. If you would like to find out more, please contact me or any of our deacons and staff members.

With the return of the cup let me remind everyone that, while you receive the fullness of the Eucharist when receiving the body of Christ, this is completed by receiving the Blood of Christ. Some may still not want to return to receiving from the cup due to health reasons and that is fine. If you are not receiving the Blood of Christ, a gesture of a bow would be appropriate as you pass by the minister with the cup. There are two ministers of the Body of Christ at the head of the middle aisle as usual. There is a minister with the Blood of Christ near each doorway.

We have also resumed the **Offertory Procession**. The Eucharistic Ministers will ask a couple of parishioners before mass to bring forward the bread and wine. It is truly a wonderful way to participate in the celebration of the mass on behalf of all parishioners gathered together. If a Eucharistic Minister asks you to bring up the gifts, please consider do this on behalf of our parishioners.

A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR PETER BROCKMANN

Our Preparation song this weekend is WITH GOD, LIFE NEVER DIES by our pastor, Father Francis O'Brien. Composed in the spring of 2020, at the beginning of the Pandemic Lockdown around the world, its hopeful message it was inspired by Pope Francis' *Urbi et Orbi* (Latin for To the City and the World) address of March 27, 2020 (https://bit.ly/WithGodLifeNeverDies). It was indeed a despairing time for many, many people. There were of course, millions infected with the novel coronavirus, many of whom died from complications or from the coronavirus. Millions more were fearful of what a global lockdown might mean for the future—was it really temporary? what if it was extended? how could one pay the mortgage? go to school? do their job? Could the world even recover from such a setback? How will it change culture, norms, the way we work and play and worship?

But close to home, you might recall that at first it was declared that people could not go to church, and then later permitted to do so only if congregants sat far apart, didn't sing, wore masks, received only the Body of Christ, didn't touch any book and if the sanctuary was disinfected weekly. Yikes. Dark days indeed. Sigh. Many of the most vulnerable living in nursing homes, palliative care facilities and hospitals were isolated from families, contracting the disease and then dying without caring family members present. Thousands were denied access to their loved ones in nursing homes, palliative care facilities and hospitals. A very dark time indeed.

Meant to inspire hope at a time when the current events filled the world with despair and darkness, the verses are constructed to remind us repeatedly that "Christ is there. Christ is there." and then as we prepare for the refrain: "Christ is by our side." Yes, he's been there the whole time. He's always with us.

Next week, we're planning to have our Children's Choir (grades 1-5) sing the Preparation song (SACRED SILENCE).
