



From Fr. Fran

Which Mass Counts for What?

With Christmas falling on a Monday this year, there has been a bit of confusion about next weekend's fourth Sunday of Advent schedule. The old "does this mass count for both" question has returned as such: "If I go to Mass on Christmas Eve will it count for both Sunday and Christmas?" Sorry, there are no "twofer" specials going on next weekend! Of course, the idea of "counting for" has its roots in the idea that our Sunday obligation is more of a "thing" to check off on a list to get us into heaven, rather than an experience that brings us closer to God and one another.

The character of the liturgy on the Fourth Sunday of Advent sets the stage for the drama of the Christmas Scriptures. To skip it is to deprive yourself of an opportunity of God speaking to you, and of the parish family joining together in excitement and prayer before the coming feast.

So, the playbook is as follows for next weekend's Masses: the celebrations for the Fourth Sunday in Advent are Saturday, December 23 at 4PM and Sunday, December 24 at 10 AM. The Masses for the Feast of Christmas are on Sunday, December 24 at 4PM and 7 PM, and Monday, December 25 at 10AM. As is our tradition, the parish adult and children's choirs will join with us in a carol sing before the 4PM Mass on Christmas Eve. Please plan to participate in the festivities beginning at 3:30PM. It will be great to see you there and to worship as a parish family!

A Gift for the Parish.

As the end of the year draws closer, this is a great time to make your donation to this year's Grand Annual Collection. As you can see by our weekly thermometer, we still have *quite* a way to go to hit our goal, but I'm confident we will be able to achieve it with your help. Thanks so much to all who have been so generous so far.

A Rose is a rose.

I'm often asked why, on the Third Sunday of Advent, do we have a change in vesture color? Well, the switch from purple to rose (no, it's not pink) has ancient origins.

It seems that as early as the fifth century, Advent was a six-week season with a penitential character, much like Lent. On the third Sunday of Advent, "Gaudete Sunday" the people were called to "rejoice" that they were halfway to Christmas. This was in keeping with a similar Sunday in Lent "Laetare Sunday" when the disciplines of the season were somewhat relaxed.

When Advent was shortened to four weeks, Gaudete Sunday remained, not as the middle of the season, but as the penultimate celebration before Christmas. With the reforms of Vatican II, the season of Advent is no longer linked so closely with Lent as a penitential season, rather it is seen as a time of intense expectation for the coming of Christ into the world in our day and his return at the end of time.

Just when the hustle of the season can start to get overwhelming, Gaudete Sunday comes along as a reminder to rejoice. In a Gaudete Sunday homily a few years ago, Pope Francis summed the celebration up nicely when he said: "Gaudete Sunday is known as a 'Sunday of joy', and instead of fretting about all they still haven't done to prepare for Christmas, people should think of all the good things life has given them." Pretty good advice, don't you think?

Please join us in coffee and conversation after the 10AM Mass this weekend to welcome Fr. Jack Carmichael, our new parochial vicar. As you know, Fr. Carmichael is joining us in anticipation of him being named either administrator or pastor of St. Matthias Parish when my assignment ends this spring. The next few months will be a wonderful opportunity to introduce Fr. Carmichael to our parish family before he "takes the reins". I'm sure you will give him a warm St. Matthias welcome!

Saint Matthias Parish Financial Results For the First Quarter Ended October 31, 2023

The Parish ended on October 31, 2023 the first quarter of the fiscal year with a loss of (\$10,318).

Total Income for the period was \$99,155 vs. Total Expenses of \$109,473.

During the quarter, the Weekly Offertory averaged approximately \$3,500 per week compared to the budgeted goal of \$4,000 per week.

Here is something to consider – if the Parish had achieved the weekly offertory goal of \$4,000 per week for the 18 weekends of July through October, the Parish would have realized an additional \$9,000 in income. That would have decreased the actual loss of (\$10,318) to a much smaller loss of (\$1,318).
