#### From Fr. Fran

Let me thank those parishioners who gave the gift of their time, energy, and expertise to make our celebrations of the Christmas season so meaningful. Thanks to those who prepared the church inside and out for the season. Thanks to everyone in our great music ministry who, joined once again this year by a choir of our youngsters, led us in beautiful sung prayer. Thanks to all of those in our liturgical ministries who provided prayerful presence, warmth, and hospitality throughout the season. Thanks to our wonderful staff for their untiring dedication to our parish community. And thanks to our newest parish member, Fr. Carmichael for stepping to the plate while I shivered under the covers with COVID.

#### Back to "The Ordinary"

In this time between the Christmas and Lenten Seasons, we celebrate a stretch of what is known as Ordinary Time. In this case Ordinary refers to "numbered" not "humdrum". It's sort of a breather after the joy of Christmas and before the work of our Lenten journey begins. Our liturgical colors are back to green, our music is a bit less festive than at Christmas, and our gospels will revolve around two themes: the call of Christ and the healings of Christ.

Perhaps this would be a good time to reflect upon how God has called us to lives of love, care, forgiveness, service, and discipleship. As we then hear the stories of Jesus's healings, we may want to discern what we need to be healed of ourselves. What keeps us from saying "yes" to Christ each day?

Well, we *thought* it was winter. *Then* it was monsoon season. I wonder what's next?

Just a reminder that when the Marlborough Schools call off classes, our office is closed, and weekday mass is cancelled. On days when the schools are *not* closed but the weather is rough, I tend to err on the side of caution and cancel weekday mass. This cancellation will be done by 8AM via our parish web page and phone message. Please check them both in case one doesn't get published promptly.

## A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR PETER BROCKMANN

Welcome to Ordinary Time!

It's definitely not a regular season of the church year, though. It's called Ordinary because of the Latin root word, *ordo*, which means ordered or numerically organized.

For us in music ministry, it's a time to mix things up a little recited Penitential Rite led by our deacons, a different Mass setting and recited response to the Prayers of the Faithful. I think you'll agree that the music in the Christmas season really spiced it up this year.

The Mass setting we've chosen for this six week period before Lent, is Mass of the Lamb by Father Fran, which has a solemn and formal tone. Frankly, what I have come to appreciate about our range of Mass settings is the tone that each musical suite brings to mind. Mass of St Matthias by Fr Fran is full of Christian joy, and with the musical Sprinkling Rite makes it wonderful for Easter season. The Mass of Angels and Saints by Fr Janco has a delightful and highly attractive stitching of the Hosanna phrase in the Holy, Holy, Holy and Great Amen that makes one think it will never end (as singing Hosanna and Amen won't end when it's our turn to sing it in heaven). The Missa de Lumine by Kathleen Demny which we first sang at Advent is evocative of a simpler and ancient time where chant reigned supreme.

Through these settings, we hope to expose our hearts to a different dimension of worship, and remind us each of our small parts in God's great plan. We change it from season to season so that we can feel refreshed, comfortable, but not complacent.

We've also produced (thank you Father Fran, again) a worship booklet for Ordinary Time with all the prayers, responses and non-hymnal hymns and songs. You can find everything there. So, it's a great worship resource, tuned specifically for this season.

PS - it's time to join us for Choir rehearsal - Wednesdays, 7 pm. Right here in the church. Hear you soon, and until then.


