

From Fr. Fran

Thank you, Fr. Carmichael

I have been informed that Cardinal Sean O'Malley has ended Fr. Jack Carmichael's assignment as parochial vicar here at St. Matthias Parish. We thank Fr. Carmichael for his warm pastoral presence over the last few weeks and wish him well in the months ahead. When I am given my new assignment Fr. Carmichael may be back as administrator.

Changes Coming with the Sacrament of Confirmation

Cardinal Seán O'Malley has approved a proposal that would lower the age of confirmation within the Archdiocese of Boston from tenth grade to eighth grade. This decision was made after a lengthy consultation with priests, catholic school administrators, parish faith formation directors, and representatives of a number of ministries in the archdiocese. The committee also reached out to a number of other dioceses that have lowered the age of Confirmation.

The question put to these groups was whether lowering the age of Confirmation would increase the likelihood of young people staying with the Catholic Church for their whole lives. It was presented to the groups that youngsters are making the decision to continue with the church or leave it in middle school. The hope is that the lowering of the age of Confirmation will strengthen young people's connection with the church during a time when they are making strides in their intellectual as well as spiritual growth. It was also emphasized that the grace of the sacrament would be of great advantage to youngsters as they begin their high school years.

This change will be phased in over two or three years. Pastors have been given the opportunity to implement the change at their discretion and with great pastoral sensitivity.

For St. Matthias Parish, this change *will not* affect the 9th and 10th graders now preparing for the Sacrament. The next administrator/pastor of our parish will be tasked, along with the Faith Formation Director to implement the changes.

Some of us of a certain age may remember that Confirmation was indeed celebrated in middle school for many years. Many of us were confirmed in the 6th through 8th grades. The trend of moving Confirmation to high school took hold during the late seventies. The idea was that we could keep youngsters "in the fold" for a longer period of time if Confirmation occurred in the higher grades. This led, unfortunately, to Confirmation being seen as a "right of passage" rather than what it is - the completion of the Sacraments of Initiation. On the positive side it also led to many great moments of catechesis and service for high schoolers. The many retreats and service projects that were an integral part of formation for Confirmation in high school surely led to many youngsters forming deep faith commitments. It is hoped that this will continue when the age of Confirmation is lowered.

In the early church, when those becoming Catholics were primarily adults, you received the three Sacraments of Initiation, - Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist - all together at the Easter Vigil after a long period of

preparation. This has been recovered today with the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, the RCIA. When entire families were welcomed into the church, children and infants also received all three sacraments together. Over the ages, and for *many* reasons, the three Sacraments of Initiation became separated from each other in the western church, leading to our present tradition of infants being baptized, second graders receiving the eucharist, and highschoolers being confirmed.

While the lowering of the age of Confirmation will have its challenges, it affords us all an opportunity to learn more about the Sacraments of Initiation, rethink how we catechize children, and help us as adults to see how our initiation into the Catholic church initiates us into lifelong service in the name of Christ.
