



#### From Fr. Fran

#### Meeting With Bishop Mark O'Connell

Members of our Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Council, and staff met last week with the Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Boston, Bishop Mark O'Connell. The discussion focused on the frustration our parish leadership has experienced with the archdiocese in regard to our participation in the Pastoral Collaborative process. Our leadership was also concerned about the future of our parish as a new pastor is about to be appointed upon my departure this spring. I'd like to thank those who attended the meeting for their candor and their dedication to the life of our parish. I'd also like to thank Bishop Mark for agreeing to meet with us and for his thoughtful and pastoral response to our concerns.

All in all, it was a very good meeting. Our parishioners outlined how the back and forth of the Pastoral Collaborative process has resulted in a feeling of instability in the parish. Some participants wondered if we have been forgotten out here on the edge of the archdiocese. A frustration was voiced that the decision for St. Matthias *not* to become a Pastoral Collaborative with St. Michael was not communicated to us in a timely or appropriate manner last spring. Also expressed were concerns that the next pastor be someone who is open to listening to and respecting the parish leadership and not a "my way or the highway" kind of leader.

In response, Bishop Mark apologized for the way in which our situation was handled last spring. He conveyed that the archdiocese decided to wrap up Pastoral Collaborative process by June of last year. A good number of assignments needed to be settled in the closing weeks of May. Ours was one of the situations that he acknowledged should have been handled better. He does not foresee that St. Matthias will be in a Pastoral Collaborative going forward. He sees the need and value in our parish continuing to be an important pastoral presence in our community. He expressed that he will try his best to find a priest to be our next pastor who will reflect the hopes and desires of the parish leadership.

He also admitted that as we in the parish are feeling a sense of instability, the archdiocese is going through something similar, in that the archdiocese is anticipating the retirement of Cardinal Sean. As the cardinal himself put it in a recent Boston Globe interview, his retirement will come "sooner rather than later". It's anybody's guess who Pope Francis will name as our new archbishop and in what pastoral direction he will take the archdiocese.

This "in-between time" is not easy. As our parish and our archdiocese awaits new leadership, let us ask the Holy Spirit to guide those making decisions, and to help us to walk into the future with open hearts.

#### Come Celebrate The Most Important Days of the Church Year

Holy Week and the Easter Triduum are the focal point of our liturgical year. Everything else stems from the celebrations about to take place.

We begin with **Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion** which has a two-fold character. The celebration starts as we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into the city of Jerusalem

with our procession around the church (on Sunday) or from the back to the front of the church (on Saturday). Then we hear the story of Christ's Passion which leads us into a deep reflection on the final days of Jesus' work on earth.

On Tuesday of Holy Week, **The Chrism Mass** will be celebrated at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston. Cardinal Sean will bless the sacred oils which will be used in the sacraments of Baptism (Oil of Catechumens, Chrism), Confirmation (Chrism again) and the Sacrament of the Sick (Oil of the Sick). These blessed oils will then be distributed to all the parishes within the archdiocese.

The rest of the week is rather quiet until we come to Holy Thursday evening when the **Easter Triduum** begins. The word "triduum" means "three days". The Easter Triduum is an entire season in itself. **The three days consist of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and The Easter Vigil/Easter Day**. The days begin at *sundown*, keeping the ancient tradition of days commencing in the evening.

The liturgical celebrations of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and The Easter Vigil/Easter Day are seen as one continuous feast, with three distinct movements. Holy Thursday moves us into the season with the commemoration of the Last Supper and contains the "mandatum" or the washing of the feet at which time Jesus commands his disciples to do for others what he has done for them. With our washing of each other's feet, he is commissioning us to do the same.

The second movement of the Easter Triduum comes on **Good Friday** with the commemoration of Jesus' Passion and the Veneration of the Cross. Traditionally this celebration is held at 3 pm in the afternoon on Good Friday. However, in our part of the world, it has become tradition to gather on Good Friday evening.

From Good Friday night to Holy Saturday evening we have a very unique second day of the Triduum. It is sometimes called a day without sacraments. There is no major liturgical movement on this day. It's as if we are keeping watch, waiting for the celebration of Christ's resurrection.

With dusk on Saturday the **Easter Vigil** begins the third day of the Triduum. Throughout the world the faithful gather around the Easter fire, bless the Easter candle, process into a darkened church and share the new light until the building is aglow with light of Christ piercing the darkness. Those adults who have been preparing to join the church will be baptized at his celebration, and the already baptized will renew their vows to love and serve God and one another.

The third day of the Easter Triduum continues on **Easter Sunday morning** with joyous celebrations of the resurrection. The Triduum ends as dusk descends on Easter Evening with the celebration of Evening Prayer.

I would like to personally invite everyone to come together and celebrate these wonderful liturgies at St. Matthias Parish. Holy Week and Easter provide us another opportunity to reconnect with each other as we join in prayer, praise, and song, thanking God for the gift of new life in Christ.
