A MESSAGE FROM FR. JAMROZ

Dear Members of the Catholic Women's League:

As we just finished the Easter Season, I would like to share with you a brief reflection on the role of women in the Resurrection story. In the Gospel of John, it is to a woman, Mary Magdalene, to whom Jesus first appears, instructing her to go and tell the disciples of His Resurrection and Ascension to the Father (Jn 20:17-18). It is significant that it is a woman who is sent by the Risen Lord Himself, and what she proclaims is the standard apostolic formula of the Resurrection: "I have seen the Lord." Which is why, in the Western Church tradition Mary Magdalene received the honor of being called an apostole—"the apostle to the apostles" (in Latin, apostola apostolorum). Indeed, we are all, men, and women, called to be witnesses to the Resurrection of the Lord.

I am grateful for all you do and the way you witness to the Resurrection in our parish community and beyond. May God abundantly bless each of you and your families.



2022 CONVENTION UPDATE:



HOSPICE PALLIATIVE CARE

* National Hospice Palliative Care Week - May 1st to 7th *

During the first week of May members were asked to participate in the 12 Hours of Prayer for Palliative Care CWL initiative by setting aside an hour and praying for accessible palliative care in Canada.

National Chairperson of Education and Health Margaret Schwab advises:

"In March 2023, the federal government will review medical assistance in dying (MAiD) legislation again. This time, the discussion will be about eligibility for individuals with mental illness as their sole underlying medical condition. It is a frightening step, and members need to advocate through letter writing and prayer for more funding for better mental health care. It is unthinkable that people would choose death because they do not have access to the help they need to choose life."

"The League has taken a position that urges the federal government to identify palliative care as an insured health service covered under the Canada Health Act and develop a national strategy for uniform standards and delivery of palliative care as defined by the World Health Organization. It is crucial to remind government officials that this has not been accomplished."

EDUCATION REPORT 2022

St. Michael Catholic Women's League support the students at Sir Edgar Bauer and St. Nicholas Catholic Elementary Schools and St. David Catholic Secondary School.



Present enrolment:

Sir Edgar Bauer Catholic Elementary School: (JK to Grade 8) 372 students

St. Nicholas Catholic Elementary School: (JK to Grade 8) 450 students

St David Catholic Secondary School: (Grade 9 to Grade 12) 897 students

This year, we provided bookmarks to the students receiving **The Sacrament of 1**st **Holy Communion and Confirmation** from both our Elementary Schools.

1st **Holy Communion** for Sir Edgar Bauer CES was held on May 29^{th} , 2022 and St. Nicholas on May 18^{th} , 2022. A total of 53 students received this Sacrament.

The Sacrament of Confirmation for Sir Edgar Bauer CES was held on May 19th, 2022 and St. Nicholas CES on May 12th, 2022. A total of 43 students received this Sacrament.

The Lady of Good Counsel Award will be presented to a graduating student who is an active parishioner of St. Michael Parish in June. This is an award which is shared with the Parish.


Membership dues: Dues remain at \$30 for 2023.

Starting the year with COVID restrictions and concerns meant in-person gatherings were not possible, but we tried our best to keep members up to date and in touch with each other and the League.

Throughout the year, regular email updates were sent and phone calls made to members, both to check in and to keep in touch. Members really appreciated this personal connection with their League Sisters.

CWL lead the Rosary virtually (zoom), for members, parishioners and friends. We prayed together weekly during Lent and Advent as well as during the months of May, June and October. When things opened up, we were happy to also lead the Rosary in the parish weekly during October.

Our first general meeting, since March 2020, took place in early November. It was so nice to have members gather in-person again. At this meeting we conducted the instructed vote for our council. We gathered again in December at a local restaurant for our Christmas dinner social. Another lovely time spent together with League members and our Pastor and Spiritual Advisor, Father Jamroz.
