

Some Thoughts on Today's Scripture

 Perhaps today's Gospel invites us to be with Jesus in the profound suffering this must have caused Him. You might then let Jesus be with you in the ways you suffer when people are not sensitive to, or show respect for your dignity as a human being or as a Christian.

 The citizens of Nazareth recognize the wisdom of Jesus' teaching, and accept that he has performed "deeds



- Even after all the miracles of healing which Jesus worked, he still was not accepted even in his own town. As he taught in the synagogue there his hearers were amazed that this ordinary man whom they knew as the carpenter could attain such wisdom, and they rejected him.
- Jesus was 'amazed' at His neighbors' unbelief. He has lived among them for thirty years and all they see is 'the carpenter, the son of Mary'. How long have I known Jesus and what/whom do I see? I ask for the grace to know him better.
- Lord, I pray that I may recognize your presence in the ordinary encounters of my day and notice the ways through which you desire to nourish me and give me life, because you are present in all things.
- Lord, there are depths in each of us, even those we think we know well, that only you can glimpse. A put-down tells more about the speaker than about the victim. Save me, Lord, from such folly.
- Lord, save me from spoiling the lives of others or my own. Let me amaze you a little by responding more often to the gentle calls of grace!
