

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Jeremiah 20:7-9

In this particularly poetic passage, Jeremiah complains that while teaching the Lord's word, he is subjected to insults and derision. He determines to remain silent, but he cannot because the desire to speak the Lord's name is "like a fire burning in my heart."

Second Reading: Romans 12:1-2

Paul tells the Christians to make sacrifices to avoid the trappings of the times, and to do God's will.

Gospel: Matthew 16:21-27

Jesus tries to make his disciples realize that by following him, they will endure suffering, degradation, and death. He tells them that they must deny themselves and take up the cross in order to be his disciples.

Where: Under the tent in front of Connery Hall All donated items should be in good, usable condition.

What's being collected:

- clothing of any size (except NO winter clothing at all)
- shoes of any size (except NO winter boots or high heels)
- accessories such as purses, belts, hats, and backpacks
- linens such as sheets, towels, curtains, comforters, and bedspreads
 - toys (stuffed and hard toys BUT must be 14" or smaller)
 Place all donations in tall kitchen sized trash bags (no boxes please)

What happens to the donated items? The company we are using, *Millennium International Textile Inc.* does <u>not</u> shred donated items. The clothing is sorted and exported to those in need, some to the poorest areas of the world and some to over 200 local and national charities within the United States. Many of these recipients live in very warm climates which is why winter clothing is not needed.

St. Clement's Religious Education will be paid by the pound and use the funds toward this year's community service projects.


