# PASTORS COLUMN

On Tuesday we began the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. After the 7 PM Mass of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception that day, about 40 parishioners joined with me in looking over the words of Pope Francis in the document, *Misericordiae Vultus*, which announced the Jubilee Year. I highlighted for them some of the areas of that document for our reflection and offer some of the same here for those of you who could not make it.

- Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy.
- We need constantly to contemplate the mystery of mercy.
- \* Mercy: The word reveals the very mystery of the Most Holy Trinity.
- Mercy: The ultimate and supreme act by which God comes to meet us.
- ❖ **Mercy**: The fundamental law that dwells in the heart of every person who looks sincerely into the eyes of his brothers and sisters on the path of life.
- Mercy: The bridge that connects God and man, opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness.
- At times we are called to gaze more attentively on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's action in our lives.
- After the sin of Adam and Eve, God did not wish to leave humanity alone in the throes of evil. And so He turned his gaze to Mary, holy and immaculate in love.
- ❖ When faced with the gravity of sin, God responds with the fullness of mercy. Mercy will always be greater than sin, and no one can place limits on the love of God who is ever ready to forgive.
- God's mercy, rather than a sign of weakness, is the mark of his omnipotence—St. Thomas Aquinas
- The mercy of God is not an abstract idea, but rather a concrete reality with which He reveals his love as that of a father or a mother, moved to the very depths out of love for their child.
- Jesus entered upon his passion and death, conscious of the great mystery of love that he would consummate on the Cross.
- Everything in Jesus speaks of mercy.
- What moved Jesus in all situations was nothing other than mercy.
- Jesus reveals God as the Father who never gives up until He has forgiven the wrong and overcome rejection with compassion and mercy.
- Jesus affirms that mercy is not only an action of the Father, it becomes a criterion for ascertaining who His true children are.
- Mercy is the very foundation of the Church's life.
- The Church's credibility is seen in how she shows merciful and compassionate love.
- The Church is commissioned to announce the mercy of God, the beating heart of the Gospel, which in its own way must penetrate the heart and mind of every person.
- The Lord Jesus shows us the steps of the pilgrimage to attain our goal (see Luke 6:37-38).
- ❖ Human beings, whenever they judge, look no farther than the surface, whereas the Father looks into the very depths of the soul. How much harm words do when they are motivated by feelings of jealousy and envy! To speak ill of others puts them in a bad light, undermines their reputation and leaves them prey to the whims of gossip. To refrain from judgement and condemnation means, in a positive sense, to know how to accept the good in every person and to spare him any suffering that might be caused by our partial judgement, our presumption to know everything about him. But this is still not sufficient to express mercy. Jesus also asks us to forgive and to give.
- ❖ We cannot escape the Lord's words to us, and they will serve as the criteria upon which we will be judged. (see Matthew 25:31-45—the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy)
- ❖ Let us place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the center once more in such a way that it will enable people to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with their own hands.
- This is the opportune time to change our lives! All one needs to do is to accept the invitation to conversion and submit oneself to justice during this special time of mercy offered by the Church.
- ❖ It is easier for God to hold back anger than mercy—St. Augustine
- Mary attests that the mercy of the Son of God knows no bounds and extends to everyone, without exception.

### **MARCH FOR LIFE**


