THE CLOSING OF OUR SCHOOL

A number of parishioners have posed questions about the recent announcement of our school. Some of the most frequently asked ones are posted here for the information of all.

O: Who made the final decision to close the school?

A: The decision is made by the Pastor, from the information at hand, with the counsel of the Finance Committee, in consultation with the Superintendent of Schools and with the permission and support of the Bishop.

Q: Does the diocese have a formal process or procedure for school closure?

A: Yes, when the enrollment of a school falls below 100 it is considered educationally and financially critical. Once the projected enrollment for the 2016-17 academic year was known the Pastor spoke to the Superintendent of Schools who informed the Bishop. Once the decision had been made then the process for the closing of a school is now being followed as outlined in the Diocesan School Office Manual of Policies and Procedures for the Closing of a School.

Q: Was it ever a consideration to enable the community to gather resources and perform actions to potentially save the school?

A: Fundraising is a key ingredient in the fiscal wellbeing of any Catholic school. The fundraising efforts of the HSA so far this year have netted \$55, 645 of a \$125,000 goal. The school budget deficit for this year alone is over \$300,000, and no amount of fundraising or appeals to parishioners would have been able to cover that deficit. Next year, with only 69 students enrolled in the school, the deficit would have exponentially increased

Q: Was information about the precarious situation shared with the school parents?

A: Yes. At a meeting with the Pastor and Principal on March 8th, parents in attendance were informed that, "The Finance Committee will meet on April 6th and the school is the major agenda item for that meeting, so your commitment needs to be known as we go into that meeting. We need that commitment so that together we may continue the great good which takes place in our classrooms each day". The parents were also informed at this meeting: "For your comparison and information, the parish subsidized the school \$230,000 in (2013-14) and \$ 170, 000 last year (2014-2015)." This information was also communicated to those parents who did not attend the March 8th meeting in subsequent meetings between the Principal and parents about the school contract.

The following information was shared with the parents on April 20th at the parent meeting: "By April 4th we had contracts for 41 students. After a series of reminder calls, we were given contracts for an additional 11 students. In those calls, we were also informed that 20 students from the current school population would not be returning. This would be in addition to the 20 who would graduate this year. From a student population of 112, K-8, 40 would not be returning. As of today, we have a total of 69 students with contracts for next year."

Q: What will happen with the Endowment Fund?

A: The Endowment Fund was created in order that St. Vincent de Paul School could receive subsidy from the investment income earned each year. The Endowment provides that if and when the parish school closed, the remaining funds from the Endowment will be used for tuition aid for children of St. Vincent de Paul Parish who attend other Catholic grade schools.

Q: What will happen with the school building?

A: The school building is currently used for religious education programs, the Confirmation program, spiritual and various social events. The building will continue to be used for that purpose.

Please continue to keep the faculty, students, staff and parents of our school community in your prayers. May the Holy Spirit be a source of comfort and consolation during this time of transition.




