

There was a great turn out for the Blessing of Animals last Sunday. The clear majority of pets in attendance were dogs (20+) with 2 brave cats. Thank you to those who brought their favorite owners to the blessing. I commend you on how well behaved your humans were. More photos of the event may be viewed on our parish website.

The class portion of our Faith Formation classes begin today. I will have the joy and privilege of teaching the 9th and 10th grade Confirmation candidates after the 6 PM Mass. On Sunday, October 1st, I met with the parents of our children and teens in the Faith Formation programs to encourage their participation in all aspects of faith formation. Central to our faith formation is our presence and prayer at Mass. The Church is very clear in teaching us. The Code of Canon Law states: On Sundays, and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are obliged to assist at Mass. They are also to abstain from such work or business that would inhibit the worship to be given to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, or the due relaxation of mind and body (Canon 1247). The Catechism of the Catholic Church reiterates this precept and adds: The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin (CCC 2181).

Of course these teachings apply to all Catholics who seek to place themselves under obedience to Christ as his disciples. The Mass, while the central action of our worship, also provides for our ongoing formation in faith. At Mass we listen to the Word of God in the sacred texts of the Scripture. This Word forms and shapes our hearts and minds keeping us in the peace of Jesus. To assist you in understanding the sacred texts a Bible Study is offered each Thursday from 1-2:30 PM and repeated from 7:30-9 PM which focuses on the readings for Mass. Those who participate have found that the insight which is offered and the discussion shared helps greatly in their journey of faith. Soon a Formation program will begin on the Sacraments and the Bible—information about this and many other opportunities for faith formation can be found in the bulletin, on our parish website and by calling the parish office.

Our formation in faith is a life long journey. When we take the time to learn we also grow in awareness of the richness which is offered to us in the Mass and that in turn makes our desire to adore and love God even greater.


